The official agreement linking the two communities was finalized ten years ago and was signed by the mayors of both towns. "The concept of twinning among towns helps promote the sharing of culture, and has resulted in lasting bonds of friendship" states Charles Eades, chairperson of the Ocala Twinning Committee.

### **Ocala Water Resources**



Ocala Water Resources Conservation Coordinator Rachel Slocumb explained the process of the water resources in Ocala. Slocumb showed how toilet tissue verse non toilet tissue breaks down. It was amazing to see. If you ask you can get a brochure that tells you what not to flush down the toilet. The list is just common sense. Remember the toilet is not a garbage can. Wipe grease out of pans and put in the trash bag for garbage pickup.

Slocumb explained some of the processes they use to break the grease buildup from the walls of the pipes. 

### **Do Readers Still Want Print?**

Back in 2010, Signet Research, Inc. released data on readers' platform preferences when consuming content in media brand issues. The objective was to learn whether the sentiment that print was a fading format, was premature and exaggerated. The results showed a strong preference for the print format over the digital version.

Signet continued to gather data for the last 10 years and recently provided our clients with the updated results. The results show that the significant preference for print still exists for readers of B2B media brand issues.

The current numbers represent the most recent 18 months of studies conducted. The percentage who prefer print only is 51%. In comparison, the preference for digital only is just 19%. UNDERSTANDING SOCIAL SECURITY SPOUSES' BENEFITS

Marriage is a tradition that exists on every continent and in nearly every country. Having a partner not only means creating a family unit, it means sharing things like a home and other property. Understanding how your future retirement might affect your spouse is important. When you're planning for your retirement, here are a few things to remember:

Your spouse's benefit amount could be up to 50 percent of your spouse's full retirement age amount, if you are full retirement age when you take it. If you qualify for a benefit from your own work history and a spouse's record, we always pay your own benefit first. You cannot receive spouse's benefits unless your spouse is receiving his or her retirement benefits (except for divorced spouses). If you took your reduced retirement first while waiting for your spouse to reach retirement age, when you add spouse's benefits later, your own retirement portion remains reduced, which causes the total retirement and spouses benefit together to total less than 50 percent of the worker's amount. On the other hand, if your spouse's retirement benefit is higher than your retirement benefit, and he or she chooses to take reduced benefits and dies first, your survivor benefit will be reduced, but may be higher than what your spouse received.

If the deceased worker started receiving reduced retirement benefits before their full retirement age, a special rule called the retirement insurance benefit limit may apply to the surviving spouse. The retirement insurance benefit limit is the maximum survivor benefit you may receive. Generally, the limit is the **higher of**:

- The reduced monthly retirement benefit to which the deceased spouse would have been entitled if they had lived, **or**
- 82.5 percent of the unreduced deceased spouse's monthly benefit if they had started receiving benefits at their full retirement age (rather than choosing to receive a reduced retirement benefit early).

#### Letter to the editor School Board Fails Children

The Marion County School Board votes four to one to keep three novels containing pornographic content in our high schools.

In a hearing before the School Board of Marion County, held August 19, four school board members; two former teachers, a pastor and the director of "Marion County Child's Alliance", voted to remove the three books from middle schools but to keep them in high schools. Only one school board member had the moral fortitude to want the books remove from all schools. The titles are; "The Bluest Eye", "Beloved" and "Dreaming in Cuban".

These books and others in use in our schools contain very graphic sexual content including; sexual conduct, sexual excitement, sexual battery, sexual bestiality and incest.

The School Board and the Superintendent have refused to address the issue of pornographic content in our schools even though it has been brought to their attention for years. After many failed attempts to quietly get the Board and the Superintendent to remove this type of content from our public schools, to protect children and to follow the law, members of "It's Your Tea Party Florida" formally objected to nine Under novels found in school libraries. Board Policy 4.3, a committee was formed to review the books. After reviewing the books, the committee recommended keeping all the books in middle and high school libraries. It was decided to take the next step to protect our children from this filth and appeal these three books to the School Board. Surely, if we show them exactly what we are talking about they will

do the right thing. Unfortunately, even after being shown many passages in each book, the statutes and hearing our pleas to protect children attending Marion County Public Schools, the Board decided to remove only these three fictional novels from middle schools but to allow them to remain in our high schools. The pleas of parents and community members to protect our children and follow Florida law continues to fall on largely deaf ears.

Apparently, they understand that this content in not acceptable for minors and are willing to protect our children from these three novels, through middle school, but once they reach high school it is perfectly acceptable, even necessary to expose minors to this content. The School Board, the Superintendent and the administration refuse to address the issue of all the rest of the sexually explicit content in our schools.

Under the Florida Constitution and state statute the School Board is responsible. Why are they not accountable? How do we make them accountable?

Florida Statute 1006 "Support for Learning" states in at least five different places that content that is pornographic or obscene is prohibited. For example; statute 1006.34(2)(b)4 "Any instructional material containing pornography or otherwise prohibited by s. 847.012 may not be used or made available within any public school."

Why does the School Board insist on continuing to allow children to be exposed to pornographic content without parents' knowledge or consent?




