The Ocala Business Leaders speaker Dr. Paul Banerjee was invited by Stacy Edmondson Cruz of Magnolia Family Urgent Care here in Ocala. Probably the most enlightening things was. "There are people who die with COVID-19 and there are people who die from COVID-19!" A person could have Heart trouble or other illnesses and because of their weakened condition they contract COVID-19 and die of heart failure, how do you count that? There is a lot of confusion about how it is counted according to some people. They say that if someone die's of COVID-19 the hospital gets four times more money than if they died with COVID-19.

Dr. Paul Banerjee is the Medical Director for Polk County Fire Rescue, Polk County Sheriff's Office SWAT team, Dr. Banerjee is board certified in Emergency Medicine and is an Associate Professor in Emergency Medicine at the University of Central Florida School of Medicine, Mercer University School of Medicine and the University of South Florida School of Medicine. Dr. Banerjee was an EMS 10, 2017 Innovator of the year and the State of Florida Medical Director of the year in 2012. Dr Banerjee is also a member of the Metropolitan Collaboration of EMS Medical Directors.

What do you think of all those certifications? Dr. Paul Banerjee recently gave a talk on COVID-19. During his talk he gave facts about how long the virus could live on different surfaces. Plastics, stainless

steel, cardboard box etc. Then he gave statistics about the outbreak itself and the fact that the virus is very similar to other viruses that we have had around for years. Yes it's bad but there are many good things being tested right now that is showing a promising cure. When ask, would you take the antivirus when they offer it? He said he would probably wait a while and let others take the Vaccine. Your chance of catching the COVID-19 is .24 of one percent. That means we have a 99.76 chance of not getting it. One of the questions ask is the COVID-19 numbers inflated. He said he had not seen signs of that.

In my estimation Doctor have to decide, if patient with COVID-19 passes away did they die of COVID-19 or was cause of death something else. As I understand

there is a different monetary figure. If they die of COVID-19 they receive four times more money. Most doctors would not take advantage of this.

While trying to understand the percentages I have been getting from sources the sources have figured the percentage of people that have been tested. There are millions of people who have not been tested.

Last month, voters throughout our community went to the polls and decided several local elections and, in some cases, selected candidates for the November ballot. While these local raises are

very important, I would like to mention an item about which you will start hearing more soon.

Safety. It is probably something we all take for granted until we need it. It is important to our families and to our businesses. We all want to know that in time of emergency, we can depend on our first

responders such as the fire and rescue to come to our aid. We also want to know that our roads will be safe to travel.

In March 2016, Marion County voters approved a one-percent sales tax for public safety and transportation infrastructure. There are no salaries nor recurring costs paid by the sales tax revenues. Since January 2017, the tax has brought in approximately \$180M in estimated revenue that has funded dozens of projects including:

- Building of Northwest 49th Avenue to improve traffic-carrying capacity and enhance the opportunity for economic development in the area.
- Rehabilitation of over 53 miles of roadways including: County Road 464B,

County Road 326, County Road 316, County Road 42, and County Road 320

- Marion County Fire Rescue equipment including: 12 new ambulances, 5 new engines, 1 ladder truck, 300 selfcontained breathing apparatus, and new fire station at Rolling Greens
- City of Ocala has completed 12 road improvement projects valued at over \$1.9M
- City of Ocala also added 2 new fire stations and a police district office

Additionally, the City of Ocala and Marion County have seen their ISO ratings improve: Ocala to a 2 and Marion County to a 3. These improvements are in large part thanks to the sales tax and provide relief to property owners through lower insurance costs in addition to knowing that our homes and families are safer.

Our economist reveals that *at least* 30% of the taxes are derived from individuals who do not live in our community. This could include tourists who are visiting our

parks or competing in equine events or simply passing through on the interstate. It also includes the approximately 80,000 people who commute into our community to work. The sales tax ensures they are helping to fund the roads they drive on and the first responders on which they depend.

On November 3rd voters in Marion County will have the chance to extend public safety and highway safety with a FOR vote for the 1% local sales tax. We still have a substantial backlog of equipment needs and transportation projects. Should the sales tax fail to pass, the cost for these improvements will be levied on property owners.

Key facts regarding the sales tax:

- One-percent sales tax limited to 4 years
- January 1, 2021, and sunset on December 31, 2024
- Funding only Public Safety (40%) and transportation infrastructure needs (60%)
- Paid for by all county residents AND

Folks have been seeking the clear waters of Marion County for millennia.





3. Subscribe to official text alerts and connect with official social networks to learn about new developments before, during and after a disaster.

- 4. Keep your mobile devices fully charged. Have charging cables handy and consider picking up a car or portable charging device.
- 5. Protect your technology with waterproof re-sealable plastic bags.
- 6.Download emergency-assistance apps from the Red Cross and FEMA.

7. Make sure your phone supports

Wireless Emergency Alerts and that you have enabled notifications on your device. Visit t-mobile.com/wea for details on how devices.

8.Set up Wi-Fi Calling on your phone if you have a phone that supports it. For Apple phones, go to Settings > Phone > Wi-Fi Calling; for Android phones, go to Settings More Connection Settings > Wi-Fi Calling.

Early in my term as Mayor, I began a project to help the chronic homeless. I continued to see men on the street that were being arrested constantly for crimes involving being

homeless. I felt something needed to be done to help them. About that time, former Mayor Rick Baker from St. Petersburg spoke at the evening lecture series at IHMC about his new book The Seamless City. He was describing a scene of a homeless encampment in front of his City Hall and the demands of the community to do something about it.

He then told the story of how he worked with the community to create Pinellas Hope, a tent city of sorts that got the homeless population the help they needed to get back on their feet. Many in the room turned to me and said "Mayor, why don't you do that here in Ocala". So the two year journey began.

I, along with Karla Grimsley, Father Patrick Sheedy of Blessed Trinity, Brothers Keepers, Catholic Charities and First Methodist Church, all gathered together and went to visit Pinellas Hope. We brought the idea back to Ocala and folks said, "that's a

OPENARMS point, we had 22 acres in Northeast Ocala donated to us but since the neighborhood wasn't behind it, it didn't pan out for our project and ended up becoming the home of Transitional Learning Center (TLC) which was a perfect fit for them as they needed exactly 22 acres for their project. However, we still needed a home. St. Marks Methodist Church on Northeast Eighth Ave. heard about our project and wanted it to be their mission. We met with them and members of the neighborhood to get their buy-in and they all wanted to be a part of it.

The idea was to convert unused Sunday School rooms to small apartments for the homeless men. We got that done and started the process of bringing in men. We hired an Executive director to run it and a counselor do case management. It is run on a small budget but here are the results: At any given time, we have around 12 to 15 men in the program. These are men who have come to us and have said, "I'm done. I can't live like this anymore, I need help and I'm willing to do all the things necessary to get myself out of this situation". And this is the most important part and the key to what separates them from others you see on the street who are not willing to commit. And we hold them accountable. When they leave our program, they have moved from being homeless with only the clothes on their backs to having a job, a place to live and

have served 178 men through this program. I always brag on our community about how compassionate we are and how we want to help people if we know there is a need.



TOO..."

I show a scar on my hand from a razor blade cut, which was the weapon of choice in the 50's.

On my way to basic training, I became aware of the number of black kids who were on the train with me. 





- I received an anonymous call that a black classmate of my daughter was bring a knife to school and was going to kill my daughter.
- The girl was apprehended the next morning and, indeed, admitted she was jealous of my daughter and was going to kill her.
- I cannot imagine the shoes I would be walking in after that event if the little

girl was successful.

- The Principal of the school, pressured by the oversight of a NAACP counselor, decided that this would be a "...kids will be kids..." incident.
- The Mother of the little girl burst out "Are you two nuts? If you are not going to punish her I am!" She, then, apologized to all of us.

I have never forgotten that incident nor the response by the Mother. At 80 years old, I have accumulated a host of anecdotal stories that could have affected my interaction with minority communities. But anecdotes do not measure a group of people. All they do is create more blisters. We all have our shoes that became too tight or too

Solutions to perceived racial and social injustices will never be solved from anecdotal events. If your shoes hurt, buy a new pair of shoes. I did and eventually provided careers to people of all colors and gender equivocations, unapologetically, without the pain of shoes that no longer fit.

"As the Chair of the Statewide Task Force on Opioid Abuse, I will work to make sure local, state and federal agencies are coordinating efforts. Identifying effective strategies and implementing them statewide will improve the state's response by making sure everyone is using the latest and most effective data and resources. Much in the same way, ensuring the public has an online portal with the latest information and medical recommendations will help Floridians make informed decisions and fight the opioid crisis in their communities."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Following Executive Order 20-52, Attorney General Ashley Moody today activated Florida's Price Gouging Hotline for all consumers in the state. The opening of the hotline comes as Governor Ron DeSantis declares a state of emergency in response to positive test results of 20 coronavirus-infected patients in Florida. The Attorney General's Price Gouging Hotline can only be activated following a state of emergency declaration issued by the Governor and covers essential commodities outlined in Florida Statute, Section 501.160.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, We are monitoring the COVID-19 situation in Florida very closely and following the Governor's state of emergency declaration, our price gouging laws are now in effect. I have a rapid response team ready to immediately respond to allegations of price gouging and our Consumer Protection Division continues to look for scams by fraudsters who would use this situation to rip-off Floridians.

'Be on the lookout for scams and guard against gouging, but remember, the best thing you can do right now is heed the advice of health experts—wash hands regularly and stay home if you are ill."


woodshed. Children actually face two problems, abortion and fatherlessness.


