How are Supreme Court Justices selected?

vacancy on the Court and the Senate votes to confirm the nominee, which requires a simple majority. In this way, both the Executive and Legislative Branches of the federal government have a voice in the composition of the Supreme Court.

Are there qualifications to be a Justice? Do you have to be a lawyer or attend law school to be a Supreme Court Justice?

The Constitution does not specify qualifications for Justices such as age, education, profession, or native-born citizenship. A Justice does not have to be a lawyer or a law school graduate, but all Justices have been trained in the law. Many of the 18th and 19th century Justices studied law under a mentor because there were few law schools in the country.

The last Justice to be appointed who did not attend any law school was James F. Byrnes (1941-1942). He did not graduate from high school and taught himself law, passing the bar at the age of 23.

Robert H. Jackson (1941-1954). While Jackson did not attend an undergraduate college, he did study law at Albany Law School in New York. At the time of his graduation, Jackson was only twenty years old and one of the requirements for a law degree was that students must be twenty-

The President nominates someone for a one years old. Thus rather than a law degree, Jackson was awarded with a "diploma of graduation." Twenty-nine years later, Albany Law School belatedly presented Jackson with a law degree noting his original graduating class of 1912.

How is the Chief Justice selected? Does the most senior Associate Justice become Chief Justice? Like the Associate Justices, the Chief Justice is appointed by the President and confirmed by the Senate. There is no requirement that the Chief Justice serve as an Associate Justice, but 5 of the 17 Chief Justices have served on the Court as Associate Justices prior to becoming Chief Justice.

Three were members of the Court when they were elevated to Chief Justice:

Edward Douglas White (Associate Justice 1894-1910, Chief Justice 1910-1921)

Harlan Fiske Stone (Associate Justice 1925-1941, Chief Justice 1941-1946)

William H. Rehnquist (Associate Justice 1972-1986, Chief Justice 1986-2005)

Two had a break in service between their periods of service:

John Rutledge (Associate Justice 1789-1791, Chief Justice 1795)


Charles Evans Hughes (Associate Justice 1910-1916, Chief Justice 1930-1941)

Ocala Fire Rescue Launches the Ocala Recovery Project

(OCALA, Fla.) Oct. 1, 2020 - Ocala Fire Rescue is launching the Ocala Recovery Project (ORP), a complimentary program for addiction rehabilitation.

Funded by a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) grant and the Marion County Hospital District, the ORP was designed to reduce opiate overdose deaths and dependency. Through a systematic approach comprised of Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT), outpatient treatment, inpatient treatment, and counseling, the ORP addresses participants' emotional, psychological, and physiological well-being.

The program aims to help recurring overdose patients, new and expectant mothers suffering from substance dependency, Substance Exposed Newborns (SEN), and anyone ready to begin the path toward recovery.

"Addiction can affect anyone, at any time," said OFR Captain Jesse Blaire. "With a hands-on approach, including emotional support and comprehensive medical care, we are certain that participants will achieve program success."

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), opioids are currently the main driver of drug overdose deaths. Between Jan. 1 and Sept. 30, 2020, first responders in Marion County received 1,101 calls resulting from overdose or poisoning. Moreover, 1,022 doses of the opiate blocking drug, Narcan, were administered in Marion County during this

Family Caregivers Of Veterans Save Money



Family Caregivers Of Veterans Eligible For Free Professional Help

(NAPSI)—The Elizabeth Dole Foundation and U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs have launched an emergency respite care fund for the family caregivers of wounded, ill, and injured veterans. The program, Respite Relief for Military and Veteran Caregivers, will provide non-medical, no-cost, professional home care to veteran caregivers who are struggling during the COVID-19 pandemic. CareLinx, a nationwide professional home care network, helped launch the fund with a donation of \$1 million worth of services. Wounded Warrior Project then contributed an additional \$1 million to expand the program. The Foundation expects to provide 75,000 hours of care to more than 3,000 veteran caregivers.

"The lack of affordable, convenient, professional respite care has always taken a significant toll on the emotional and physical well-being of veteran caregivers,"

said Steve Schwab, CEO of the Elizabeth Dole Foundation. "Now, due to the increased health risks and limitations created by the pandemic, we are seeing a spike in the need for short-term relief."

Even as states re-open, some of the most critically wounded or ill veterans and their caregivers will have a long journey back to the pre-pandemic world. These veterans often have vulnerable immune systems that require their caregivers to take every precaution against exposure. By asking family and friends to keep their


family and friends to keep their distance, they are losing a vital source of daily support.

"We are grateful to CareLinx and Wounded Warrior Project for helping us respond to this urgent need," Schwab continued. "We hope other organizations also step up, so we can ensure every veteran caregiver suffering during COVID-19 receives the help they need."

The program is rolling out in select regions and will expand nationwide over time. Eligible caregivers can request services that include companionship, grocery shopping, cooking, mobility assistance, transportation, bathing, and other activities of daily living. AARP and Bob Woodruff Foundation have also joined as key collaborators for this effort to help spread the word to military and veteran caregivers.

When peak season ends, freezing strawberries can be a great option. It's easy to do. Simply rinse strawberries under cool, running water and gently pat dry. After removing the stems, place strawberries on a parchment-lined cookie sheet and freeze for 24 hours. Then transfer the strawberries to a plastic freezer bag. Strawberries can stay in the freezer for several months. Frozen strawberries maintain their sweetness and are versatile enough to be used in recipes ranging from smoothies to ice cream, baked goods to breakfasts.

Here's a nutritious recipe using frozen strawberries in waffles:

Strawberry Oat Waffles

Yield: 6 mini/3 regular waffles

1 cup oat flour

Attorney General **Moody Advances Fight** to End the National **Opioid Epidemic Even** as COVID-19 **Pandemic Rages**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—The COVID-19 pandemic has changed

daily routines around the world, but it hasn't lessened Attorney General Ashley Moody's resolve to end the deadly opioid crisis plaguing Florida. Even as the novel coronavirus spreads, Attorney General Moody continues efforts to curb the national opioid crisis claiming lives in Florida—issuing statewide recommendations to address the opioid crisis, creating new partnerships to help Floridians struggling with substance abuse and crafting criminal justice training to assist prosecutors in shutting down the sham sober home industry.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Our nation and our state face many challenges, but be assured that nothing will dampen my resolve to put an end to the national opioid crisis that continues to claim lives in our great state. Even before the COVID-19 pandemic struck Florida, we were working hard to stop opioid misuse and save lives, and as we continue to work together to stop the spread of COVID-19, please know that our fight against the deadly opioid crisis has not abated.

'There are signs that the pandemic may be contributing to an increase in opioid deaths, and that is even more reason why we cannot waiver in our fight to stop drug abuse—and why I will continue to work every day, on the local, state and national level, to end this deadly crisis affecting Florida families.'

Attorney General Moody began working to stop the crisis even before taking office in 2019. Recent efforts, amid the COVID-19 pandemic, include:

As Chair of the Statewide Task Force on Opioid Abuse, Attorney General Moody and members of the team completed and issued the Task Force's report of findings and recommendations;

Continuing to enhance and update the Attorney General's statewide resource DoseOfRealityFL.com with information to help Floridians struggling with addiction;

Securing a new partnership with 211 to help better connect Floridians with local substance abuse treatment and counseling

Creating and distributing a new virtual training tool to assist prosecutors in shutting down the sham sober home

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic,

Attorney General Moody's efforts included: Assembling a statewide working group of experts to identify strategies and best practices for addressing the opioid crisis;

Issuing a strategic report for combating the national opioid crisis impacting the lives of Florida families;

Personally appearing in court and advocating for expediency in the state's opioid litigation to hold responsible the nation's largest opioid distributors, manufacturers and pharmacies;

Securing a successful ruling denying the defendants' motions to dismiss the state's opioid litigation; and

Pushing back against the loosening of opioid prescribing guidelines by requesting that the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services reverse a recommendation that medical providers rely on personal judgment instead of consulting evidence-based recommendations, including opioid prescription duration and dosage.

Provisional data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention include 70,980 fatal overdoses in 2019, with about 1,000 more deaths to likely be added, marking a 4.8% increase from the year before. The data indicates the U.S. last year likely eclipsed the prior record high of 70,237 overdose deaths set in 2017—and that the pandemic could exacerbate the

In August, Attorney General Moody sponsored a cabinet resolution declaring Aug. 31, International Overdose Awareness

Attorney General Moody Obtains Judgment Resolving Community Health **Systems Data Breach Investigation**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody, along with 27 other state attorneys general, obtained a judgment against Tennessee-based Community Health Systems, Inc., and its subsidiary, CHSPSC LLC. This judgment resolves an investigation of a data breach that impacted approximately 6.1 million patients, including more than 430,000 from the state of Florida.

At the time of the data breach, CHS owned, leased or operated 206 affiliated hospitals, including 37 located in Florida. Information exposed in the breach included the addresses, birthdates, names, phone numbers and Social Security numbers of patients. The judgment, agreed to by CHS, requires a \$5 million payment to the states and provides that CHS agrees to implement and maintain a comprehensive information security program reasonably designed to safeguard personal information and protected health information that will

include specific information security requirements.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Health care patients are routinely asked to reveal personal information in the course of treatment. The added stress surrounding a data breach exposing personal information can be overwhelming. Î'm glad we were able to provide relief to the more than 430,000 Floridians impacted by the negligent actions of this health care company."

Specific information security measures contained in the agreed judgment include requirements to:

- · Develop a written incident response plan;
- · Incorporate security awareness and privacy training for all personnel who have access to protected health information:
- · Limit unnecessary or inappropriate access to protected health information;
- · Implement specific policies and procedures regarding business associates, including use of business associate agreements and audits of business associates.

In addition to Florida, represented by Consumer Protection Division assistant attorney general Patrice Malloy, the <u>ice-programs/domestic-</u> multistate group includes Alaska, Arkansas, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Washington and West Virginia.

The proposed judgment is pending judicial approval.

Attorney General Moody Recognizes October as National Domestic Violence **Awareness Month**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody is recognizing October as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month by reminding victims of domestic violence that help is still available to them amid the COVID-19 pandemic. With many Floridians limiting social and professional interactions to stop the spread of the novel coronavirus, domestic violence can be even harder to detect—and victims may not know where to turn for help. Victims do not need to isolate with their abusers and abuse counselors have adapted to the pandemic to provide more communication resources for victims. Advocates can be reached 24/7, 365 days a year through the Florida Domestic Violence Hotline by calling 1(800) 500-1119.

Attorney Ashley General Moody said, With signs that domestic violence cases may be on the rise amid the COVID-19 pandemic, it is more important than ever for victims of domestic violence to know they have our support and that help is available. Domestic violence shelters across the state are open and advocates are available 24/7 to

provide safety to victims and their families with protocols to protect against COVID-19 in place. If you or someone you know are a victim of domestic violence, know you are not alone. Please reach out for help.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, domestic violence centers have worked tirelessly to ensure that services remain available to survivors and the community. These services not only meet the needs for safety from violence but also incorporate measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Domestic violence center outreach and shelter services remain operational and advocates are available 24/7 to develop safety plans for survivors and families based on specific needs throughout the pandemic. Survivors, as well as their friends, family members and other community members can contact any domestic violence center through its 24hour hotlines. Local certified domestic violence centers have increased the ability to communicate with survivors through the use of various applications.

In April, Attorney General Moody shared resources available to victims of domestic violence throughout the pandemic, urging anyone isolated with an abuser to contact law enforcement and seek help to escape

In May, Attorney General Moody announced a partnership with Uber that offered free rides to help victims of domestic violence escape abuse. Through the program, free Uber rides were directed to domestic violence shelters in areas of Florida that saw the highest call volumes during the stay-at-home orders including Hillsborough, Orange and Pinellas

Also in May, Attorney General Moody spread awareness about a free secure reporting app, SoSecure, for victims of domestic violence. The app, available on all Apple and Andriod devices, can help domestic violence victims signal for help without alerting abusers with a simple swipe on mobile phones.


