Emergency Care to Injured Police K-9s

Governor Ron DeSantis Signs Legislation to Provide Emergency Care to Police K-9s Injured in Line of Duty

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – Today, Governor Ron DeSantis joined members of the Florida Legislature and Florida's law enforcement community to support law enforcement canines injured in the line of duty by signing Senate Bill 388.

"Law enforcement K-9s are often the first to put their lives on the line as they work to apprehend dangerous or armed suspects in high-intensity situations," said **Governor Ron DeSantis**. "From responding to fires to finding missing persons to detecting narcotics or explosives, law enforcement dogs use their unique abilities to rescue victims and detect danger. I'm proud to sign this legislation today to ensure they quickly receive the care needed to recover when injured in the line of duty."

"I applaud Governor DeSantis and the Legislature on this bill that will help protect our K-9 partners," said **Florida Department of Law Enforcement Commissioner Rick Swearingen**. "These dogs are a great asset to Florida law enforcement and the communities we serve and enhancing the ability for them to get critical care in the line of duty is important."

"People often forget that canine officers

are an integral part of our law enforcement family," said **Senator Tom Wright**. "We must do everything in our power to protect these animals and make sure they are cared for in the same way as any other officer. I want to thank Governor DeSantis and my colleagues in the Legislature for supporting this bill unanimously throughout the process. We will maintain our steadfast commitment to support all law enforcement officers in Florida."

"I would like to thank Senator Wright for allowing me to run this good bill with him and for the support of Attorney General Moody and you, Governor DeSantis, for signing this important legislation," said **Representative Sam Killebrew**. "As many of you know, I'm a big advocate for animals as well as law enforcement. Canines often risk their lives to protect others and are hurt in the line of duty; this bill will allow EMT personnel to provide emergency medical care and transport them to a nearby veterinary clinic. Simply, it takes a proactive approach to saving the lives of these officers."

Senate Bill 388 strengthens Florida's commitment to protecting our law enforcement, including canine members of the force. When a law enforcement canine is injured while safeguarding our

The purpose of the CEP is to be the One-Stop Shop and Voice of the Business Community. We are the designated economic development organization for all of the Ocala Metro. While many focus on our Business Attraction successes

(bringing in new major employers like Amazon, Dollar Tree, and FedEx) or our Business Services programs (such as Business After Hours, Tuesday Talks, and Leadership Ocala Marion), it is our Business Retention and Business Creation efforts that really have the ability to impact the business community. This is especially true as we continue to go through a difficult crisis such as the current COVID-19 pandemic.

Our Business Retention efforts are focused on assisting existing businesses throughout the community with a particular focus on primary employers (manufacturing, distribution, and large office). We work with approximately 200 businesses every year REGARDLESS of their partnership with the CEP. In other words, a business does not have to be a CEP partner to receive assistance. Much of this work is focused on removing barriers to

their growth. Sometimes this means connecting them existing resources on the local, state, and federal level. Other times it means we are connecting them with other businesses to the benefit of both.

Business Creation coordinates all of the CEP's entrepreneurship efforts. Assisting would be entrepreneurs and small business owners is an important part of both the CEP's mission and the growth of our community. While these efforts are most often associated with the Power Plant Business Incubator, the Business Creation team works with more than 400 entrepreneurs a year the majority of which will never be incubator residents.

Our newest effort in this area is our IMPACT initiative sponsored by Ausley Construction. IMPACT focuses on expanding access to entrepreneurship in West Ocala, Silver Springs Shores, and Marion Oaks. We run multiple cohorts of the nationally recognized FastTrac program to provide 10-weeks of entrepreneurship training. Successfully completing these programs hosted with the City of Ocala qualifies a business as a Diverse Small Business Enterprise. Additionally, we recently completed a Microenterprise Loan Program targeting businesses in these areas with both the City and the County.

Population

We recently received the latest estimates from the US Census Bureau, the Ocala Metro continues to be one of the fastest growing in the nation. As of 30 June 2020, the Ocala Metro had a population of more than 373,000. Our growth rate ranked as the 10th fastest in the nation and we now rank as the 146th largest metro out of nearly 400.

Ocala Cultural Arts

Ocala's cultural community is robust. It is comprised of organizations big and small, independent artists, arts education providers, and regionally known facilities and festivals, all of which provide the city and county with programs that range from the performing and visual arts to culinary arts and historic preservation. The City of Ocala is a strong proponent of arts and culture in the community. This includes partnerships with local art organizations and the development of visual, performing arts and educational science programming.

The City of Ocala Cultural Arts & Sciences Division presents many events and programs including public art, [First Friday Art Walk](#), the biennial [Ocala Outdoor Sculpture Competition](#), [Art in City Spaces exhibitions](#), [Tusawilla Art Park Series](#), the [Levitt AMP Ocala Music Series](#), and partnerships with community events around the city. The [Discovery Center](#) features quarterly science exhibits, permanent animal exhibits, educational classes, exhibit dates nights and summer camp.

In addition to these programs we utilize

our public spaces, both interior and exterior, to provide exhibit and performance space to local, regional and national artists and cultural arts organizations.

Florida State Senate

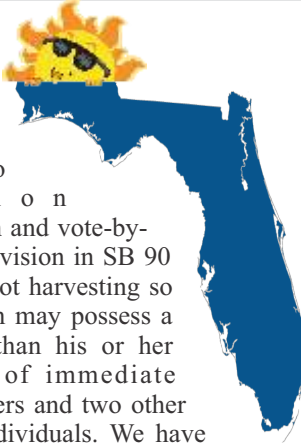

Dear friends,
In continuation of last month's column, we will be bringing you some more highlights of the 2021 Legislative Session. Last month was our budget update, and this month will be a highlight of legislation that was sponsored and passed by your Senator of the 12th District. Overall, we passed thirteen bills, either as stand-alone bills or added to a larger policy package.

Our priority legislation was SB 90, relating to Election Administration was passed through both chambers and signed by Governor DeSantis shortly after Session

ended. This bill addresses a number of issues related to election administration and vote-by-mail. One provision in SB 90 addresses ballot harvesting so that no person may possess a ballot other than his or her own, those of immediate family members and two other designated individuals. We have tightened up the security around drop boxes. Our bill requires that they only be used during early voting hours, and that they must be monitored, in person, at all



times by staff or volunteers of our Supervisor of Elections. Also, the bill expands the timeframe for canvassing vote-by-mail ballots, providing that one vote-by-mail ballot request is good for all elections through the next regularly scheduled general election. Current law states that one request is good for all elections through the next two general elections. This change is necessary to provide voters with more flexibility to decide which method of voting they want to utilize, instead of being locked in for two cycles.

Another priority bill for us this year was HB 282, Moments of Silence in Public Schools. This legislation requires that every classroom in K-12 schools begin their day with a moment of silence. In a noisy, busy world, just think of the impact that one moment of silence might have for all of us. We want to give our young students this chance to pause and reflect, and maybe even say a prayer. Thank you to the rabbis who

brought me this idea and for all the hard work they did in helping us get this passed in Florida.

One that hit home for me, personally, was the passage of SB 272, which establishes a Rare Disease Advisory Council within our state. As the father of a daughter with a rare disease, I know how hard it can be to find the resources and support needed to deal with these issues. Rare diseases are defined as any disease with less than 200,000 cases nationwide. We hope that this council will be the springboard for research and ideas for families who may be struggling with rare diseases.

Finally, SB 280 requires school districts to provide basic training in first aid, including CPR, for all students in grade 9 and grade 11. Additionally, it encourages school districts to provide basic training in first aid, including CPR, for all students beginning in grade 6 and every two years thereafter to specify such instruction for students in grade 6 and grade 8. This is common sense legislation that will help save lives and we are very happy to have been able to work this through the process.

It's honor to serve you in the Florida Senate and work on important issues like these. Thank you for sending me on your behalf.

Attorney General Moody Commemorates 200th Anniversary of Florida Sheriffs

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today presented a Florida Cabinet resolution commemorating 200 years of Florida Sheriffs. Florida Sheriffs Association President Sheriff Bobby Schultz, as well as FSA Vice President Sheriff Bobby McCallum and

FSA Executive Director Steve Casey, attended today's Cabinet meeting to accept the resolution—passed unanimously by Governor Ron DeSantis and the Florida Cabinet.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “For 200 years, our state has benefited from the Office of the Sheriff in Florida. What began as an appointed position in 1821, soon became a vital office safeguarding the lives and property of Floridians. Over the past two centuries, Florida Sheriffs have worked to uphold the rule of law and protect Floridians while improving our state through unparalleled civic engagement, breaking cycles of crime and changing the lives of troubled youth.

“Because of the Florida Sheriffs, we have countless programs and initiatives throughout our state contributing to a stronger and safer environment for all Floridians. Thank you, to all our great Sheriffs, past and present, for your service and commitment to our state and the citizens who live here.”

Florida Sheriffs Association President Bobby Schultz said, “Much like the great State of Florida, the Office of Sheriff has grown and evolved over the last 200 years. Today, sheriffs work tirelessly every day to serve and protect our communities. Thank you General Moody, Governor DeSantis and the Florida Cabinet for honoring this historic anniversary.”

In 1821, Florida Military Commissioner Governor Andrew Jackson first established the Florida Office of the Sheriff by

appointing Sheriffs to Florida's first two counties. Jackson appointed Henri Piere as Sheriff of Escambia County and James Hannan as Sheriff of St. John's County. In 1885, the state of Florida authorized the Office of the Sheriff in the Florida Constitution. Over the next 100 years, Florida established 67 counties throughout the state, each including a Sheriff's office.

Throughout the past two centuries, Florida Sheriffs have created numerous initiatives to better our state and the communities they serve, including:

- The Florida Department of Law Enforcement;
- The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches;
- The Florida Law Enforcement Academy; and
- The Florida Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission.

While Florida Sheriffs are celebrating the bicentennial of the Office of Sheriff all year, the anniversary of the office is observed on July 21.

Florida Fights Back Against Fentanyl Traffickers: Brother and Sister Drug Trafficking Duo Convicted for Selling Fentanyl

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody's Office of Statewide Prosecution secured convictions against a sibling drug trafficking duo. The defendants faced charges for selling and distributing heroin and fentanyl throughout Central Florida. The convictions come following an investigation into Hector Mojica Phipps'

drug trafficking operation involving his sister, Dilcia Mojica Phipps, serving as a proxy while Hector was out of town. Fentanyl is a highly lethal opioid and is increasing in the drug supply throughout Florida—exacerbating the opioid crisis. Nearly 21 people in Florida die each day from opioid abuse.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “This sibling drug trafficking team sold heroin and fentanyl, two key drugs at the heart of the nation's opioid crisis—disgraceful. Thankfully, my Statewide Prosecutors, working with the Metropolitan Bureau of Investigation, dismantled their operation, and these poison pushers will harm Floridians no more. Let this serve as a message to any potential fentanyl traffickers: We will find you, we will arrest you and you will serve time for your crimes.”

According to an investigation by the Metropolitan Bureau of Investigation, Hector Mojica Phipps sold and distributed kilos of heroin and fentanyl throughout Central Florida. After making initial contact with Hector through an undercover agent, MBI conducted a wiretap investigation in order to dismantle Hector's trafficking organization and uncover the source of narcotics being distributed. From the wiretap, agents intercepted calls between Hector Mojica Phipps and his source of supply in Mexico—Lorenzo Corral Martinez, a fugitive co-defendant. In the calls, Martinez arranged for Hector Mojica Phipps to receive, by a courier, three kilograms of heroin.

The investigation also revealed that Hector's sister, Dilcia, trafficked fentanyl

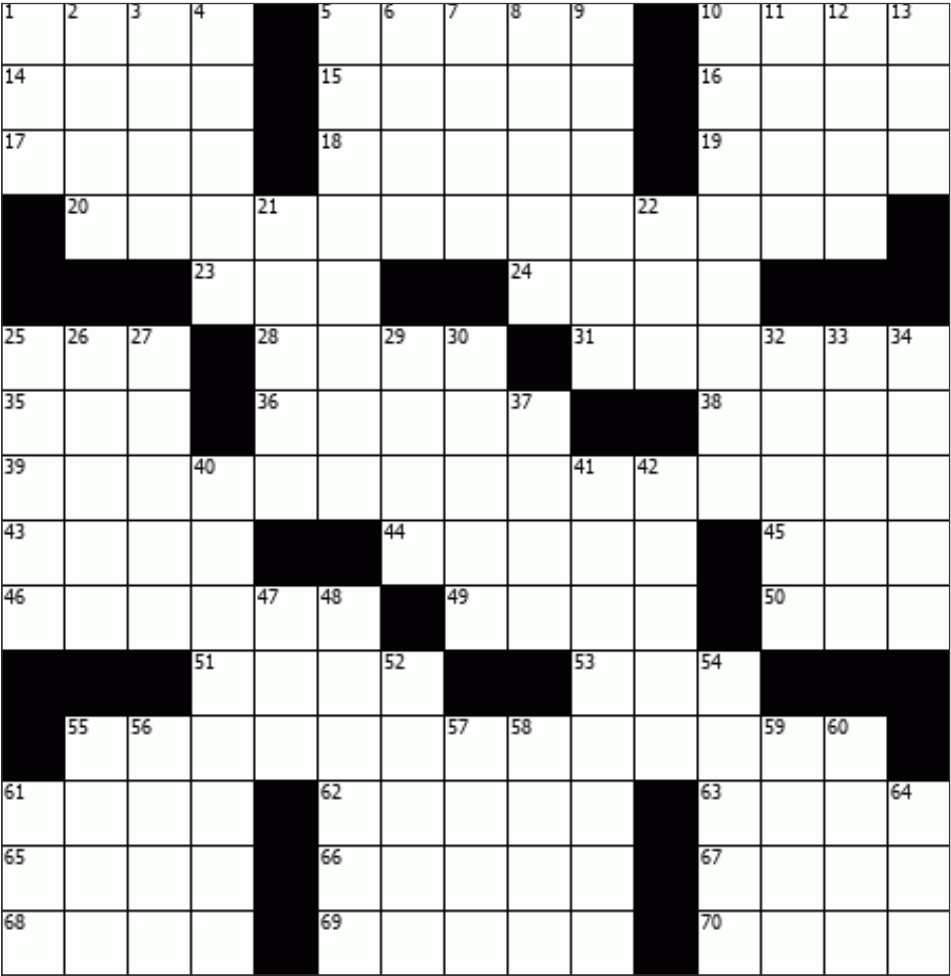

for the operation in his absence. MBI first began investigating Dilcia and Hector Mojica Phipps in 2018 when Dilcia completed a drug deal in Orlando for Hector while he was in New York. Following Hector and Dilcia's arrests, the pair's other siblings, Luis Mojica Phipps and Yajaira Mojica Phipps, proceeded to continue the drug trafficking operation. Authorities subsequently arrested Luis and Yajaira for trafficking a kilo of heroin. Luis and

Yajaira's cases are still pending. In 2018, officials arrested Hector and Dilcia Mojica Phipps. On June 3, an Orange County jury convicted Dilcia Mojica Phipps following a two-day trial. The jury convicted Dilcia Mojica Phipps of three felony charges, including trafficking fentanyl, conspiracy to traffic heroin—each first-degree felonies; and the unlawful use of a two-way communications device to facilitate the commission of a felony—a third-degree felony. Today, an Orange County jury convicted Hector Mojica Phipps of nine felony charges, including

trafficking heroin, trafficking fentanyl, conspiracy to traffic heroin—each first-degree felonies; possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony—a second-degree felony; and the unlawful use of a two-way communications device to facilitate the commission of a felony—a third-degree felony.

Assistant Statewide Prosecutors Mary Sammon and Nicole Philips of Attorney General Moody's OSP prosecuted Dilcia Mojica Phipps' case. Sammon and Assistant Statewide Prosecutor Gary Malak of OSP prosecuted Hector Mojica Phipps' case.

Shifted Axis Of The Earth



Climate Change Likely Shifted The Axis Of The Earth, According To A New Study

(NAPSI)—Global warming that caused glacial melting is likely the cause of a shift in the movement of the Earth's poles in the 1990s, according to a new study in Geophysical Research Letters, AGU's journal for high-impact, short-format reports with immediate implications spanning all Earth and space sciences.

Melting glaciers redistributed enough water to cause the direction of polar wander to turn, and accelerate, eastward, according to the new research.

"The faster ice melting under global warming was the most likely cause," said Shanshan Deng, a researcher at the University of the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

Changing Poles

The North and South Poles aren't static, unchanging spots. The axis Earth spins around keeps moving.

The Earth spins around an axis kind of like a top, explains Vincent Humphrey, a climate scientist at the University of Zurich. If the weight of the top moves, the spinning top starts to lean and wobble. The same thing happens to the Earth as weight shifts from one area to another.

Changes in polar drift can occur for a number of reasons, including changes in water on land from melting glaciers and groundwater pumping.

Changing The Length Of Your Days

The change to the Earth's axis isn't large enough that it would affect daily life, Humphrey added. It could change the length of day we experience, he said, but only by milliseconds.

While the melting glaciers were the main driver of polar drift in the 1990s, "the groundwater contribution is also an important one," Humphrey said. The analysis revealed large changes in water mass in California, Texas, China and India—all areas that pump large amounts of groundwater for agricultural use.

Backward In Time

Researchers discovered a way to rewind modern pole tracking analysis to learn why the Earth's poles shifted in the mid-1990s. The new research calculates the total land water loss in the 1990s.

"The findings offer a clue for studying past climate-driven polar motion," explained Suxia Liu, a hydrologist at the University of the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

Water Loss And Polar Drift

Using data on glacier loss and estimations of groundwater pumping, Liu and her colleagues calculated how the water stored on land changed. They found that the contributions of water loss from the polar regions was the main driver of polar drift.

"I think it brings an interesting piece of evidence to this question," said Humphrey. "It tells you how strong this mass change is—it's so big that it can change the axis of the Earth."

What It Means

Liu said the research has larger implications for understanding land water

storage earlier in the 20th century. Researchers have 176 years of data on polar drift. By using some of the methods in this study, it could be possible to estimate how much land water was lost in past years.

COVID Testing In Schools

COVID Testing In Schools What You Should Know

(NAPSI)—Enabling K-12 schools to reopen for in-person learning is a high priority for parents, communities and governments. In fact, President Biden's National Strategy for the COVID-19 Response and Pandemic Preparedness was launched to fund COVID testing for teachers, staff and students in an effort to create a safer return-to-school environment.

Getting kids back to in-person learning will mean giving working parents a break, letting parents return to full-time work, reducing the expense of tutors or childcare and providing a near-normal learning experience.

Nevertheless, concerns linger over COVID in the classroom and the possibility of children bringing the virus home. School districts have looked at options for student testing but at the top of many lists is pooled testing. Here are some common questions and answers about that:

What is pooled COVID testing?

Pooled COVID-19 testing combines swabs from consenting individuals in a classroom and runs them as a single test. This

can significantly increase testing capacity and lower costs. School personnel are trained to operate and monitor on-site sample collection, usually done weekly. In the event of a positive pool, the entire pool is quarantined and individually retested. But students who test negative can return to school immediately.

Does my child need to participate?

Participation is optional but according to district supervisors, most parents participate because regular, proactive testing can offer peace of mind. Knowing your child is in a COVID-free pool can make sending them to in-person learning less stressful. Proactive pooled testing alerts parents if a pool tests positive—which can be faster than finding out only after a child starts showing symptoms. It also means that parents know if a child tests positive, even if they are asymptomatic.

Can I trust the results?

Yes, in many states, pooled testing is already being administered by trained school personnel. Swabs are tested by Helix, a CLIA-certified lab, identified as having one of the most sensitive PCR tests on the market in an independent study conducted by the FDA.

Does testing my kids at school cost me anything?

No, having your kids tested for COVID at school on an ongoing basis doesn't cost families anything. It provides a convenient way to protect all family members and creates a safer in-person learning environment.
