It is common to equate logistics and distribution but they are not equivalent. future. Logistics involves distribution but it is more than that. Logistics is the coordination and supply of raw materials, the management of production materials and finished goods, and the distribution of these goods to end users. Logistics is distribution but also manufacturing, marketing, warehousing, service, finance, and technology.

Ocala has become and is becoming more of a Logistics Hub for all of the reasons listed. Yes, the Ocala market has seen an explosion of distribution and fulfillment centers in the last few years. One needs to only drive around the community to see this impact with the new massive Amazon, AutoZone, Chewy, McLane, and Dollar Tree facilities. But one can also see the manufacturing role in logistics and the growth of companies and facilities like Signature Brands, Custom Window a Pella Company, and Cardinal LG. The FedEx $Ground\ Hub,\ R\&L\ Trucking\ facility, ABCO,$ and Swift Transportation are examples of the important delivery component in this sector.

Because of the diverse aspects of Logistics, it can be difficult to determine the total number of people employed in this sector. However, more than 7,000 work in the distribution facilities alone. In fact, the four existing facilities in the Ocala/Marion County Commerce Park employ more than 4,100. More importantly, these facilities pay millions of dollars in local property taxes. Not only does logistics employ thousands of Ocala Metro residents, but they generate significant revenue to local governments and schools which benefits all of us.

So why has logistics become so important? Like the famous real estate axiom, the three most important factors are location, location, location. Ocala's position in the center of the state along I-75 near the intersections of both the Florida Turnpike and 301 further supports this role. The nation's premier site selection consultant told us in 2014 that when Florida's population tipped over the 20 million mark that the logistics equation would change. No longer would it be more cost effective to serve Florida from Atlanta but now Florida would need to be served from Florida. Ocala's ability to serve not only



Historic Multistate **Practices**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today announced a historic multistate action against Google over the tech giant's location tracking practices. The announcement follows a historic multistate investigation by Attorney General Moody and 39 other state attorneys general into the company's location tracking practices and cybersecurity disclosures. As a result of the investigation, the business will pay the states \$390 million—including \$26 million consumers more information and clearer options as it relates to tracking practices.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Big Tech is watching us, but Silicon Valley needs to know that we are watching them protection laws, we will take strong action to protect our citizens. This is a historic case for the privacy of Americans and the account settings are turned on or off; protection of consumers nationwide, and I am proud our office helped lead this massive, nationwide investigation."

Location data is a key part of Google's digital advertising business and is among the most sensitive and valuable personal information the company collects. Even a

Attorney General limited amount of location data can expose a Moody Secures \$390 person's identity by tracking routines that Million Through can be used to reveal personal details.

The attorneys general initiated the Action Against multistate investigation following a 2018 Google Over Associated Press article that revealed the Location Tracking company records users' movements, even when explicitly told not to. The article focused on two account settings: Location History and Web & App Activity. Location History is turned off by default, but Web & App Activity, a separate account setting, is automatically turned on when users set up a Google account, including all Android phone customers.

As detailed in the agreement, the attorneys general found that Google allegedly violated state laws by misleading consumers about location-tracking practices in various ways since at least 2014. Specifically, the company caused confusion to Florida. Google must also provide among those who thought location tracking could be limited by turning off Location History, while Web & App Activity continued to track users' locations.

Under the agreement, Google agreed to a series of provisions designed to give too, and if they violate our consumer consumers more transparency into the company's practices, including:

- Showing additional information whenever
- · Making key information about location tracking unavoidable; and
- Creating an enhanced Location Technologies webpage where users can get detailed information about the type of location data Google collects and how it's

used.

The agreement also places limits on the usage and storage of certain types of location information and requires account controls to be more user-friendly.

Florida took a leading role in the investigation and agreement negotiations, represented by Consumer Protection Division Multistate and Privacy Bureau Chief Patrice Malloy.

Attorney General Moody Recognizes **Utility Scam Awareness Day with Tips to** Avoid Scams

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody is recognizing Utility Scam Awareness Day by issuing tips for Floridians to avoid utility scams. Fraudsters aiming to swindle consumers may pose as representatives of utility companies, and claim immediate payment is needed or the customer's service will be cut off—or scammers may attempt to obtain personal information from an unsuspecting consumer. Attorney General Moody wants to ensure Floridians don't fall victim to these schemes.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said,

"Utility scammers will prey on the fear of losing an important service such as power or gas in order to elicit an immediate payment. Don't fall for these imposter scams. If you receive a suspicious message or phone call, do not provide any personal or financial information. Instead, call the utility company directly and check on the status of your account."

Attorney General Moody suggests Attorney General Moody is joined in this Floridians use the following tips to avoid utility scams:

- Understand that scammers pressure customers to act fast, so do not rush to act on an unsolicited call or email;
- Verify information given by purported utility representatives by checking the latest
- Never provide or confirm personal information to a solicitor, whether by phone, in-person or email, purporting to be a utility company representative;
- Know that utility companies will not demand immediate payment;
- When in doubt if a call is legitimate, hang up and call the utility company directly using the number listed on the company's website:
- Be wary of anyone demanding payment by a reloadable card, gift card or cryptocurrency; and
- Authenticate the identity of someone posing as a utility representative who comes to the door. Look for company ID and logo. and know whether the visit is expected or

Florida Creates Jobs for the 30th Consecutive Month, Shows Economic **Resiliency Despite Impacts of Hurricane**

More Floridians Enter the Workforce While National Labor Force Shrinks

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Today, Governor Ron DeSantis announced that Florida's economic data continues to show strength even with impacts from Hurricane Ian in Southwest Florida. In the October 2022 economic data report, Florida's labor force grew by 36,000 and Florida's private sector added 35,000 jobs. This is the 30th consecutive month that Florida created jobs, while private sector job growth has exceeded the nation's for the past 19 consecutive months.

Over the month, Florida's labor force grew by 36,000, while the national labor force shrank, and Florida's private sector employment growth was double the national growth rate. Florida's private sector employment grew by 5.6 percent over the year in October 2022 (+447,800 jobs), faster than the national growth rate of 4.0 percent.

Florida's unemployment rate increased by 0.2 percentage points to 2.7 percent, which is still historically low, and remains a full point below the nation's 3.7 percent mark. Much of the increase in the unemployment rate is due to increased unemployment in Southwest Florida following Hurricane Ian. The unemployment rate in the Fort Myers area was 3.9 percent during the month, up 0.5 points. Still, this slight increase in unemployment in Florida shows that despite the impacts of a Category 4 storm, Floridians and Florida's economy remain resilient. The Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and CareerSource Florida continue to provide resources to help Floridians find employment if they were impacted by the storm.

"Florida's economic resiliency is unmatched in the country – no other state

Category 4 hurricane and continue to grow jobs in the same month," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "We have made record investments in our infrastructure and workforce while building a record budget surplus and providing record tax reduction for Floridians."

"More Floridians enter the workforce each month because they are confident in the opportunities available to them under Governor DeSantis' consistent leadership,' said DEO Secretary Dane Eagle. "DEO is proud to support the Governor's mission through workforce education and development opportunities that help Floridians realize their potential and support our state's major industries.'

Florida's statewide unemployment rate was 2.7 percent in October 2022, remaining 1.0 percentage point lower than the national rate of 3.7 percent. Florida's statewide unemployment rate has been lower than the national rate for 23 consecutive months since December 2020.

The leisure and hospitality sector gained the most jobs among all major industries, adding 14,100 jobs (+1.1 percent) over the month, followed by education and health services, adding 8,200 jobs (+0.6 percent), and trade, transportation, and utilities, adding 8,200 jobs (+0.4 percent).

Data in the month of October continues to indicate there are many job opportunities available for Floridians throughout the state, with more than 476,000 jobs posted online. Floridians in search of work and new job opportunities are encouraged to turn to the CareerSource Florida network for help. Floridians can find guidance on how to register with Employ Florida and search listings of available local job openings. Career seekers also can improve their employability by perfecting resume writing and interviewing skills, establishing career goals, and pursuing customized career training. 
