Peace in Palestine will never happen!

The political leaders of Israel have openly stated for decades that they will never agree to a so-called "Two-State Solution".

Pointless 'negotiations' between the Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas and Israel's' Netanyahu have gone on for years.

The international community has supported the idea of a separate Palestinian State on the pre-1967 lines for years

The Palestinian capital would have been in East Jerusalem along with sovereignty over Temple Mount/Noble Sanctuary/al-Aqsa Mosque.

in the forms of alienation, emigration of young Israelis, the emergence of racist Jews, violence in society, the widening gap between Israel and the diaspora, and a general feeling of inadequacy".

Israel has become an apartheid state. In South Africa it was 'whites' against 'blacks'. In Palestine its 'Anglo-Jews' against 'Semite Moslems'.

"Apartheid" defined by the International Criminal Court as a regime of systematic oppression and domination of a racial (or religious) group with the intention of maintaining that (domination).

Some Israeli leaders have admitted that they can impose sufficient hardship on native Palestinians to drive them out. Eventually the growing number of 'illegal' settlements will be sufficient to annex the West Bank and maintain the Jewish majority.

Another proposal is to have the West Bank 'absorbed' by Jordan, and Gaza by Egypt, that way there will be no more 'Palestinians'.

President Eisenhower threatened sanctions to get Israel to withdraw from Sinai and Gaza.

President Ford reassessed US relations with Israel, refusing to provide it with new arms deals until it agreed to a Sinai withdrawal.

President Carter threatened to terminate US military assistance if Israel did not immediately evacuate Lebanon in September 1977.

Carter said that the United States would withhold aid and downgrade relations with Israel if they did not sign his 'Peace Agreement.'

US Secretary of State James Baker withheld a \$10bn loan guarantee that Israel needed to absorb immigrant Soviet Jews.

Israeli defense minister Moshe Dayan once said: "Our American friends offer us money, arms and advice. We take the money, we take the arms, and we decline the advice."

"Peace In Palestine?" Ask me again in a thousand years.



Meanwhile the person that I talked to said she received a call stating the school her daughter was at was in lockdown, her daughter was safe and in the background there were people hollering, sirens blaring. Things sounded like chaos in the background. This would be easy to fix. The parents need to know if things are under control. Don't give them a heart attack. Maybe an automatic dialing system and a brief message without the background standing right next to the shooter before they

For those of you that have not watched the video interview of the suspect in the Forest High School shooting, watch it on www.ocala.com. You will see the true story.

Preserve farmland

While Florida can use an enhanced road system, such enhancement should not compromise Marion County's wonderful farmland and horse country.

direction, turnpike traffic going to Tallahassee and points west via Interstate 10 could get over to the Suncoast Expressway, which could easily be extended to U.S. 19/98 at some convenient place in Citrus or Levy county.

My proposal would create a new roadway in an urbanized area to serve as a great eastwest connector. Meanwhile, Marion County could still preserve its wonderful farmland and horse country.

In 1968, Florida became the only state to allow for its state constitution to be revisited and changed through a regularly scheduled commission called the Constitution Revision Commission. Once every 20 years, Florida's Constitution

provides for the creation of a 37-member revision commission for the purpose of reviewing Florida's Constitution and proposing changes for voter consideration. The Constitution Revision Commission (CRC) meets for approximately one year, traveling the State of Florida, identifying issues, performing research and possibly recommending changes to the (State) Constitution. Any amendments proposed by the CRC would be placed on the 2018 General Election ballot. You can visit their web site at flcrc.gov to see all of the proposed Commission and Public Proposals, the full text of each proposed ballot amendment and additional information about the commission.

= Florida State Senate =

You might want to consider voting by mail, mailed to you by the Supervisor of Elections 35 days prior to the election. This will allow you plenty of time to review the eight (8) amendments being proposed by the CRC. In addition, there are numerous other amendments and perhaps a few local issues for consideration. The eight proposals by the CRC are as follows: 1) Rights of Crime

Victims; Judges 2) F i r s t R e s p o n d e r a n d Military Member Survivor Benefits; Public Colleges and Universities

3) School Board Term

Limits and Duties; Public School4) Prohibits offshore Oil and GasDrilling; Prohibits Vaping in EnclosedIndoor Workplaces

5) State and Local Government Structure and Operation

6) Property Rights; Removal of Obsolete Provision; Criminal Statutes

7) Lobbying and Abuse of Office by Public Officers

8) Ends Dog Racing

The fact that most of these amendments cover more than one subject should give you pause. The Supervisor of Elections in an April 18th Press Release encouraged voters to vote by mail and to expect a lengthy ballot in November. These amendments must secure 60 percent of voter approval to become law.

You may feel strongly about an issue, but consider, does this issue belong in my State Constitution or can it be accomplished through the legislative process by passing a bill to become law.

Keep in mind this is your Government, your Constitution and you decide the outcome.

SAFE DRIVING PRACTICES



The best way to reduce the risk of a traffic crash is to practice safe driving behavior. Here are some helpful tips to keep you safe. All of the following information is

readily available from driver handbooks and other government agencies:

When you're behind the wheel of a car – whether alone or with passengers – driving safely should always be your top concern. We are more distracted than ever, so it's crucial to know the basics of safe driving and practice them every time you're on the road. Your safety, and the safety of others depend on it.

Pedestrians

It is the motorist's responsibility to do everything possible to avoid colliding with any pedestrians. Bicyclists, skaters and skateboarders in a crosswalk or driveway are considered pedestrians. Turning motorists must yield to pedestrians at intersections with traffic signals. Motorists must yield to pedestrians crossing the street or driveway at any marked mid-block crossing, driveway or intersection without traffic signals.

Bicyclists

In Florida, the bicycle is legally defined as a vehicle. Bicyclists using a public roadway are considered operators of motor vehicles and are responsible for observing traffic laws. With few exceptions, there is only one

Blind Persons

The primary traveling aids for a person who is blind are often a white cane or a trained guide dog. Independent travel involves some risk that can be greatly reduced when you, the driver, are aware of the use and meaning of a white cane or guide dog.

Florida State Statutes specifically addresses motorist responsibilities as follows:

Whenever a pedestrian is crossing, or attempting to cross, a public street or highway, guided by a dog guide or carrying in a raised or extended position a cane or walking stick which is white in color or white tipped with red, the driver of every vehicle approaching the intersection or place where the pedestrian is attempting to cross shall bring his or her vehicle to a full stop before arriving at such intersection or place of crossing and, before proceeding, shall take such precautions as may be necessary to avoid injuring such pedestrian.

Simply put, that means **drivers must always yield the right-of-way to persons who are blind.** When a pedestrian is crossing a street or highway guided by a dog or carrying a white cane (or a white cane with a red tip), vehicles must come to a complete stop.

Mobility-Impaired Persons

Drivers must yield the right-of-way to mobility-impaired persons and pedestrians utilizing the assistance of a guide dog or service animal. When a pedestrian is crossing a public street or highway and the pedestrian is using a walker, a crutch, or an orthopedic cane or wheelchair, vehicles must come to a complete stop.

School Buses

On a two way street or highway, all drivers moving in either direction must stop for a stopped school bus which is picking up or dropping off children. You must always stop if you are moving in the same direction as the bus and you must remain stopped until the bus stop signal is withdrawn.

If the highway is divided by a raised barrier or an unpaved median at least five feet wide, you do not have to stop if you are moving in the opposite direction of the bus. Painted lines or pavement markings are not considered barriers. You must always stop if you are moving in the same direction as the bus and you must continue until the bus stop signal is withdrawn.

School Crossings

Crossing guards are posted in areas when it is unsafe for children to cross alone. When you see a guard, reduce your speed. You are near a school and children are in the area. Watch for school zone posted speed limit. If necessary, stop at the marked stop line. Never stop in the crosswalk. Obey signals from any crossing guard. It is the driver's responsibility to do everything possible to avoid colliding with pedestrians. Remember that children are unpredictable. Do your part to make every crossing a safe crossing.

All drivers should yield the right-of-way closest to the em to public transit buses traveling in the same it is safe to do so.

Funeral Processions

Pedestrians and drivers must yield the right-of-way to funeral processions. When the first vehicle in the funeral processions lawfully enters an intersection, other vehicles in the procession must have their headlights on as a signal to other drivers not to drive between or interfere with the procession while it is in motion unless directed to do so by a law enforcement officer.

Driveways

Drivers entering a road from a driveway, alley or roadside must yield to vehicles already on the main road. Motorists must yield to bicyclists and pedestrians on the sidewalk.

Emergency Vehicles

Pedestrians and drivers must yield the right-of-way to law enforcement cars, fire engines and other emergency vehicles using sirens and/or flashing lights. Pull over to the closest edge of the roadway immediately and stop until the emergency vehicle has passed. Do not block intersections.

"Move Over"

When driving on interstate highways or other highways with two or more lanes traveling in the direction of the emergency vehicle, and except when otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer, drivers approaching a law enforcement or other authorized emergency vehicle parked on the roadway with their emergency lights activated, will be required to leave the lane closest to the emergency vehicle, as soon as it is safe to do so.

OK now that I got that out of my system. The state of Florida does not have a good track record when it comes to abusing permanent residents. Let's list the abuses.


Let's talk about what percentage of residents across the state it displaced. Let's talk about the Turnpike because it is the Turnpike Authority enterprise that wants to

Continued from page 10 Remember that emergency vehicles include wreckers that are displaying their amber rotating flashing lights and

performing a recovery or loading on a roadside. When approaching a law enforcement or other authorized emergency vehicle parked on a two-lane roadway with their emergency lights activated, and except when otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer, drivers will be required to slow to a speed that is 20 miles per hour less than the posted speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or greater; or travel at 5 miles per hour when the posted speed limit is 20 miles per hour or less.





Mother's Day History

Kentuckian Mary Towles Sasseen thought to organize a Mother's Day celebration before anyone else in the land.

Mother's Day was recognized as a holiday in West Virginia in 1910, and became a national holiday in 1914, primarily through the efforts of Anna Jarvis of Grafton, West Virginia. Jarvis is now widely credited as the founder of Mother's Day.

In the nineteenth century, however, there were several attempts to establish a holiday honoring motherhood. Most of these celebrations were on a local level, or with political motives: one notable mother's holiday was celebrated in the cause of peace, and another was created to discourage drinking. The first Mother's Day celebration just for Mom — and the first major effort to create a national holiday in that spirit — happened right here in the fine Commonwealth of Kentucky.

The arbiter of this holiday, Miss Mary Towles Sasseen, was a tall, intelligent woman with auburn hair and a deep love for her mama. Sasseen, a schoolteacher in Henderson, Kentucky, held a Mother's Day celebration on April 20, 1887, which was her mother's birthday. As a teacher, Sasseen envisioned that Mother's Day would be celebrated primarily by children in schools. Since her first celebration, however, the holiday has gradually increased in popularity, drawing in the entire family.




