This growth is being fueled by the continuing large number of new residents relocating to the area. The Ocala Metro again ranked in the top 2 in U-Haul's annual Top

One of the best and most significant measures of the strength of the localeconomy is the housing market. 2023 was a record-year on several fronts. It marked the highest ever number of new single-family homes completed, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest number of permits issued. Additionally, it was the 2<sup>nd</sup> best year on record for the sale of existing homes. The Ocala Metro was one of only 3 Florida metros and one of only a handful nationwide that saw an increase in year-over-year sales of existing homes. Finally, 2023 saw the largest number of new Multi-Family developments to come online with the addition of approximately 2,000 units.

Cities for Growth. This is significant because it highlights the strong growth of younger residents to the community and reinforces the growth in both traditional single-family and multi-family developments. Further attesting to this growth is the record enrollment at Marion County Public Schools which surpassed 45,600 students in the fall of 2023. This reflects a 10% increase in the last two years.

Primary employment growth and investment continues at a very strong pace. Over the last two years, tracked primary employment capital investment is just short of \$1 billion and will result in the creation of more than 2,500 direct jobs. Among the highlights include a \$25 million expansion by a local manufacturer adding 200 jobs, a new 3PL which leased a recently constructed 350,000 sq. ft. spec building, and the headquarters and processing center for a mortgage company creating 300 new jobs. Additionally, the construction on the 1 million sq. ft. expansion at the Dollar Tree distribution center is wrapping up. This \$400 million project will result in the addition of 300 additional jobs. The year ended with

several very large projects actively working to wrap up negotiations on potential new facilities in the market.

Healthcare remains a strong and growing pillar of the local economy. HCA Ocala added two new free-standing emergency rooms and announced plans for \$100+ million expansions at both their downtown and West Marion campuses. AdventOcala announced plans for a new 60,000 addition at their main campus to break ground in 2024 as well. Work continued at the new UF Health Ocala Hospital with the first phase to open in summer 2024.

Finally, the resurgence of tourism as an economic driver has continued with the World Equestrian Center beginning and/or continuing construction on their Phase 2 development. The second onsite hotel, a 400 extended stay property, will open at the complex in March 2024 and construction has begun on an 80,000 sq. ft Event Center, 80,000 sq. ft. retail complex, and 6<sup>th</sup> indoor arena. The facility hosted approximately 3 million guests in the last year. WEC along with FAST (Florida Aquatic Swimming & Training) are driving a significant increase in tourism with local tourism development tax revenues setting a record for the 3rd year in row with three consecutive years of double-digit increases. As a result, nearly a dozen additional hotels are currently in the development pipeline.

Dear Friends,

It has been yet another great month in the Florida Legislature. I am honored to be able to represent the constituents of District 13 here in Tallahassee. With Session coming to an end, here are a couple of key pieces of legislation that we have had the pleasure of working on.

Firstly, The Florida Senate passed Senate Memorial 598, sponsored by Senator Blaise Ingoglia (R-Spring Hill), with bipartisan support. This memorial urges the federal government to enforce current immigration laws and secure our southern border.

The willful and systemic refusal of the Biden Administration to enforce immigration laws has allowed for a crisis to unfold at our southern border. This crisis impacts every community, not only across the State of Florida, but across the entire country as illegal immigrants overrun our southern border with those associated with drug cartels bringing weapons, fentanyl, and other contraband that devastates families and communities. Further, the influx of illegal immigration has placed a significant financial burden on Florida's taxpayers.

Not only has the Biden administration been an abject failure in enforcing existing border security measures, but Joe Biden has exacerbated the problem by suspending construction of a border wall, increasing the number of illegal immigrants limited onto the streets of our country, limiting the authority of our border patrol agents, and utilizing our unique court process to block states from addressing this historical humanitarian crisis. These intentional and disastrous policy decisions have led to a surge in violent crime, gang activity, human trafficking, an ever increasing threat of

terrorism and massive drain on taxpayer dollars and resources. It is well beyond time for the federal government to act and stop the invasion at our southern border.

Secondly, The Senate Appropriations Committee on Education passed Senate Bill 1396, sponsored by Senator Joe Gruters (R-Sarasota), with unanimous support. This legislation establishes a program to provide security funding for Jewish Day Schools.

Senate Bill 1396 builds upon House Bill 7C, passed during the 2023C Special Legislative Session, to enhance security measures at Jewish Day Schools and send a clear message that Florida stands with our Jewish neighbors. House Bill 7C provided \$25 million in funding for Jewish Day Schools to enhance hardening and nonhardening security measures.

Senate Bill 1396 empowers the Florida Department of Education and Jewish Day Schools across the State of Florida through recurring funding that can be used for security cameras, shatter-resistant glass, fencing, security personnel, and other hardening or nonhardening security measures.

Since the barbaric attacks on Israel by Hamas on October 7, 2023, America has seen an exponential increase in vile acts of antisemitism across the country, especially in education. Being a student is a time of growth, learning and a fuel for passions and interests and no student should feel unsafe when they enter the classroom, and the Florida Senate is absolutely dedicated to keeping all students safe.

We can't wait to share more with you as we conclude the 2024 Legislative Session. Thank you for your continued engagement in your government and for investing your energy in helping us continue to protect faith, family, freedom, opportunity, and life.

## Pastrami-Spiced Veal Burgers

## INSTRUCTIONS

Place the breadcrumbs, milk, and salt in a bowl and soak the breadcrumbs until softened. Mix the veal with the breadcrumb mixture and combine to form six patties. Toast the peppercorns, coriander, and mustard seeds in a dry pan. Let cool and grind them with the paprika, onion powder, garlic powder, and brown sugar. Coat the burgers with the spice mixture. Heat a grill on medium-high heat. Grill the burgers to desired doneness but at least 71°C (160°F) for food safety, adding a slice or two of cheese to each burger towards the end, to slightly melt. Spread the bottom of the bun with the mayonnaise, and top with whole grain mustard. Place the burger on the bottom, top with sauerkraut, and top with the bun.

<https://youtu.be/Eh-TMzjxFHAW> What if you could catch a glimpse into your future without relying on mysticism or fortune-tellers? Surprisingly, you can — it's right in front of you every day, if you're willing to look.

For active seniors who aspire to live their later years on their own terms, enjoying passions and relationships to the fullest, it's crucial to take stock of any warning signs lurking in their lives.

These warning signs, or "red flags," indicate that functional decline may be on the horizon. They're signals that essential abilities for maintaining quality of life and independence are slipping away. As a seasoned physical therapist, I can spot these red flags from a mile away. While they may start subtly, dismissing them as natural effects of aging is a mistake. Left unaddressed, they can quickly lead to falls, loss of independence, reliance on assistive devices, and a host of health issues. Moreover, if illness or injury strikes on top of these red flags, functional loss can escalate dramatically.

Red flags are hidden in plain sight and often manifest in daily activities like standing from a chair, dressing, stairs, getting up off the floor or walking. If you're finding these tasks increasingly challenging or requiring more assistance, you may be in the early stages of a downward spiral.

A straightforward way to test for red flags is what I call "The Elevator Test." The Elevator Test, because of the space and time required. If you're pain-free and have no medical contraindications, I strongly recommend performing The Elevator Test weekly, preferably with a supportive friend

nearby as a backup.

Here's how it works:

1. Find an open area.
2. Slowly lower yourself to the ground and lie on your back.
3. Turn to one side.
4. Turn onto your stomach.
5. Get up on all fours (hands/knees).
6. Stand up.

If you're unable to complete The Elevator Test, it's a clear indicator of red flags in your life.

Early detection is key. If you spot a red flag, address it immediately. Ignoring it will only worsen the issue over time, making it harder to correct.

The solution to a red flag often lies within the problem itself. If you struggle with stairs, practice climbing them more frequently. Use each encounter with stairs as an opportunity to improve, performing a few extra repetitions each time. Apply the same approach to any activity where you've identified a red flag. By doing so, you'll regain mastery over these activities and significantly enhance your future quality of life.

Don't make the mistake of attributing red flags to old age. Aging doesn't mean becoming feeble or losing independence. While we may never recapture our 25-year-old selves, we all have the capacity to improve, regardless of our current baseline. At the very least, we can strive to maintain independence in our daily activities well into our later years.

The future is ours to shape, but we can't afford to wait until tomorrow. The time to act is now. As Eleanor Roosevelt wisely said, "The future is literally in our hands to mold as we like. But we cannot wait until tomorrow. Tomorrow is now."

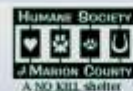
