Sarcopenia

Addressing Sarcopenia with a Healthy Diet

(NewsUSA) - Age-related loss of muscle mass and strength can significantly impact the quality of life for older adults. However, recent research underscores the role of proper nutrition in preventing and managing this condition.

Starting around age 30, the body naturally loses 3 to 5% of muscle mass per decade. This natural process can escalate into a condition known as sarcopenia if muscle loss becomes severe. The effects of sarcopenia include decreased mobility, increased risk of falls, and reduced independence.

However, boosting one's intake can help maintain muscle strength and function, reducing the risk of sarcopenia.

It's important to note that the beneficial effects of a healthy diet in addressing sarcopenia are best when coupled with resistance and aerobic exercise.

"It's very important that all adults, especially women, be aware of sarcopenia and regularly discuss dietary decisions with their healthcare professional or dietician to optimize their health as they age," advises Dr. Dorothy Fink, Deputy Assistant Secretary for Women's Health.

While muscle loss is inevitable in aging, it doesn't have to lead to sarcopenia. By incorporating the proper nutrients into our diets and maintaining an active lifestyle, we can counteract the effects of this condition and continue leading strong, healthy lives.

We all know that the Ocala Metro is growing, we just have not known how much. Now we do! The new Census numbers for Metropolitan areas and counties recently were

(Dallas, Atlanta, Phoenix) may have much smaller growth rates, they could still add tens if not hundreds of thousands of new residents. The Ocala Metro still ranked 31st in sheer numbers despite being smaller than any other metro ranked above it in this category.

When you break these numbers down on a weekly basis, it means approximately 269 people a week are moving into our community. Based on our average household size, it means we need 110 housing units a week for these new residents. We need jobs for these new residents and we need space for schools, healthcare, etc.

All of the construction you see throughout the community is a direct result of this growth. It is also why we are seeing so many new stores and restaurants open throughout the community. Our twice a month videocast, *POV: Ocala* presented by Ocala Flooring, highlights these new additions. You can find the videos on the CEP's Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn pages. You will want to check back frequently because this is the year of commercial development. It is incredible the number of new retailers and restaurants who are

released and this area is growing even faster than we anticipated. For the period of 1 July 2022-30 June 2023, the Ocala Metro (Marion County) was the 4th fastest growing metropolitan area in the nation! What does that mean? As of the cutoff date more than 9 months ago, the population of our community was just shy of 410,000 people. For comparison, the population at the 2020 Census was 376,000.

Of the 392 Metropolitan Statistical Areas in the US, the Ocala Metro now ranks 134. In 2020, we ranked 148. Not only was our growth rate (3.4%) the 4th highest, but we ranked 31st for the highest quantity growth. In other words, while extremely large metros

working on new locations.

Yes, growth does create some challenges, but it creates far more opportunities. The median wage in Ocala has grown *1/3 faster* than the national average over the last 10 years. The economy is significantly more diversified and balanced than perhaps at any

time in Ocala's history. Housing growth is robust, and the median price remains the lowest of any Florida metro and among the most affordable in the nation. All of these and more are contributing to an Ocala which is an excellent place to live, work, and play.

Dear Friends,
In the last few days, Governor DeSantis signed the following education bills into law:

HB 931 establishes a statewide school chaplain program, which:

- Authorizes school districts and charter schools to allow volunteer chaplains to be on school campuses and provide additional counseling support to students.

Chaplains will be assigned by the district school board or charter school governing board.

A student may only receive support offered by school chaplains with written parental consent.

HB 1317 authorizes districts to allow civic and patriotic organizations to visit schools to encourage student participation and involvement. These organizations include:

- Big Brothers Big Sisters of America
- The Boy Scouts of America
- The Boys & Girls Clubs of America
- The Civil Air Patrol
- Future Farmers of America
- The Girl Scouts of the United States of America
- Little League Baseball
- The Marine Corps League
- The Navy Seal Cadet Corps

SB 1264, which does the following:

- Adds to existing Communist history standards with instruction on the history of Communism in the United States and the tactics of Communist movements.

- Authorizes the newly-established Institute for Freedom in the Americas at Miami Dade College to promote the importance of economic and individual freedoms as a means to advance human progress—specifically in Latin America and the Caribbean.

This institute will partner with the Adam Smith Center for Economic Freedom at Florida International University.

- Enables the Florida Department of State, in collaboration with the Florida Department of Education, to recommend to the Legislature the creation of a Florida-based museum on the history of Communism.

- Prepares students to withstand indoctrination on Communism at colleges and universities.

- A heavy concentration of them went to one of 12 elite schools.

- About half of the policy positions in government and half the corporate board positions in America are held by people who went to one of those 12 schools.

- They are in power centers - Manhattan or D.C.

- Most Americans believe we don't have enough freedom but over 50% of the elite and 70% of the politically involved elite say we have too much freedom.

- 70% of the elite trust government to do the right thing and believe we would all be better off if they were in charge of making decisions for the rest of us.

What does the elite 1% control?

- Most of the important positions in the current and prior administrations.
- Most think tanks - both conservative and liberal ones.

- Most policy groups in D.C.

What is it that the elite 1% don't want?

- The other 99% to control how much federal taxes they pay.

- To lose the I.R.S. as a way to intimidate and control the other 99%.

- To lose the ability to reward their friends and punish their enemies using the tax code.

- To lose the ability to use the tax code to coerce people into acting against their own best interests in order to achieve an outcome that is beneficial to them.

The elite 1% in D.C. is ignoring the one real solution that allows us to remain citizens and not subjects - the FAIRtax.

The FAIRtax:

- eliminates income tax and payroll taxes

- eliminates the I.R.S.

- eliminates tax lobbyists selling tax benefits to special interest groups

- eliminates any federal tax on spending up to the amount needed to provide the basic necessities for you family

- eliminates the penalties on earnings, savings and investments

The list continues but I think you can see why the FAIRtax is seen as a threat to the elite 1%. Under the FAIRtax we pay taxes only when we decide to spend. Until then, all the money we earn all goes to us. Power is the name of the game and the FAIRtax puts that power back where it belongs - in the hands of the 99%

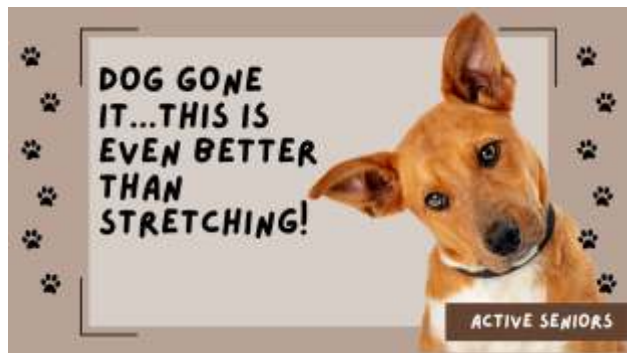

finally relaxing them, thereby stimulating a feedback loop among nerves, the spinal cord, and the brain. Pandiculation essentially hits the body's natural reset button, facilitating efficient and effective muscle movement. In contrast, stretching lacks this crucial neural feedback loop.

Unfortunately, as we age, the benefits of pandiculation diminish due to compensatory mechanisms, sedentary lifestyles, poor posture, weakness, and decreased awareness. Consider the individual who spends hours hunched over a computer each day; their muscles shorten, tense up, and become painful. Attempts to alleviate the discomfort through stretching offer only temporary relief, as the muscles revert to their shortened state shortly after.

Pandiculation, however, teaches muscles to function properly again through an innate system that naturally resets muscle length and tension. As Thomas Hanna eloquently put it, “If you want to untie a knot, you must look at the cord carefully then gently undo the tangle. Yanking on the cord will only make the knot tighter.”

To enhance the power of pandiculation, I integrate it with one of the seven foundational movement patterns: squatting, lunging, pushing, pulling, rotating, hinging, and locomotion. These movements, collectively known as the Magnificent 7, encompass all activities and profoundly impact independence and quality of life as we age.

Here's an example of pandiculation intertwined with a foundational movement pattern. If you're experiencing pain or have

any medical concerns, please refrain from attempting this exercise:

- . Stand upright.
- . Hinge at the hips and reach forward, extending your arms as if pushing against a wall.
- . Hold for 10 seconds.
- . Release the position and stand tall, extending your spine and hips, and reaching toward the floor with your arms.
- . Hold for 10 seconds, then release.
- . Stand naturally and relax for 10 seconds.

Pandiculation can be applied to all muscles and joints; just be creative and remember the three steps: contract, lengthen, and relax, within the framework of the Magnificent 7.

Take a cue from our furry companions and incorporate pandiculation into your routine after periods of inactivity. Consider this: when was the last time your dog or cat suffered from a sore back or pulled hamstring? Pandiculation might just be the “purrrfect” addition to your health and wellness regimen.”

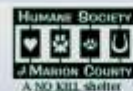

ATTORNEY GENERAL MOODY FILES CRIMINAL CHARGES AGAINST VIOLENT RETAIL THIEVES
TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney

General Ashley Moody is filing criminal charges against two violent organized retail thieves. Raheem Davis Jr. and co-defendant Vayshoun Harris are facing charges for multiple robberies at Home Depot stores across five different counties that involved physical violence against store employees.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “These two criminals committed multiple robberies at Home Depot stores across five counties, violently assaulting employees in the process. In one incident, a defendant even pepper sprayed a cashier in the face. We do not stand for organized retail theft in this state, especially theft that involves violence—I proudly stood with Gov. DeSantis recently as he signed a new law strengthening our statutes against crimes just like these. We will continue to hold these thieves accountable.”

RESCIND "ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE" INITIATIVES HARMING STATES

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today led a 23-state coalition in filing a legal action demanding that Biden's Environmental Protection Agency modify its Title VI regulations. These regulations—known as “disparate impact” regulations—are what the EPA is using to advance much of its race conscious “environmental justice” initiatives.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “The EPA should be focusing on enforcing the environmental laws passed by Congress, not so called 'environmental justice,' which is a euphemism for Biden's extreme agenda. WASHINGTON, D.C. — Today, Congresswoman Kat Cammack (R-FL-03), Congressman Seth Magaziner (D-RI-02), Congresswoman Nicole Malliotakis (R-NY-11), and Congressman Jimmy Panetta (D-CA-19) introduced the Alleviating Barriers for Caregivers Act (ABC Act).

The ABC Act would help reduce red tape for family caregivers at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and Social Security Administration (SSA) by requiring the agencies to review the eligibility determination and application processes, procedures, forms, and communications of Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security programs, and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) to reduce administrative challenges

for caregivers. It requires a report on the findings and remedy plan back to Congress within a year of the bill's enactment to streamline the policies and procedures.

"America's family caregivers work around-the-clock to provide essential care for their loved ones, and over half—56 percent—act as advocates on behalf of their family members. The last thing these caregivers need is more red tape that distracts from their support for those in their care," said Rep. Kat Cammack. "I'm honored to introduce this bipartisan and bicameral ABC Act with my colleagues to lower the burden around the important medical decisions caregivers must make every day. Together we can support the 48 million caregivers that make up a critical part of our health care landscape in the U.S."
