

Improving Mental Health

(NAPSI)—When it comes to mental health, many people across the U.S. have experienced their share of challenges-but help may be at hand.

The Problem

The issue is especially concerning in rural America, where more than 60% of people report having a mental health condition—such as anxiety or depression—yet less than half of them get the help or treatment they need. Rural Americans face unique mental health stressors and barriers to accessing care, but those living in rural communities also boast unique support mechanisms that they can tap into to flip the script on mental health stigma.

An Answer

An example of those unique support mechanisms can be found in rural Georgia, where community leader Adaris Rivera has found hope in the resilience that living in a rural community presents. "Each person's journey with mental health is deeply personal and unique, yet there's a universal truth that support and hope are within reach for everyone. No one should feel isolated in their struggles," she said. This is what inspired her to share her own story as part of a national public service advertisement (PSA) campaign called "Love, Your Mind" Continued page 8

FAIRTAX



I n m y previous article, I talked about what Scott Rasmussen

called the "elite 1%" and how they

crave power and control over the other 99% and how they oppose the FAIRtax for challenging

that craving. With so many 1%ers in DC, how will the FAIRtax ever get passed? Although we

will never stop trying to win over the federal political elite, we must also work on the state level.

Take Nebraska for example. EPIC, an acronym for "Eliminate Property, Income and Corporate

Taxes ", is a state level proposal to replace these taxes at all levels of state government in

Nebraska with a FAIRtax style consumption tax. Let's look at this proposal:

1. EPIC proposes to eliminate property, income and corporate taxes. Inheritance taxes will be

eliminated with the income tax. Corporate taxes refer to all business taxes. It proposes to

replace the current state sales tax with a consumption tax on new

goods and services at

the retail level.

2. The proposed rate of 7.5% is based on a dynamic model constructed by the Beacon Hill

Institute and has been praised by such luminaries as Stephen Moore, Distinguished Visiting

Fellow, Institute for Economic Freedom, The Heritage Foundation.

3. The proposal is to replace the state sales tax, not local sales taxes. Local taxing authorities

will have the ability to impose their own consumption tax. The rate is expected to be much

lower than the current sales tax rate because they have much less revenue to replace than

on the state level.

4. Because the EPIC plan eliminates all business taxes, not only can Nebraska businesses

expect to be the most competitive in the nation, Nebraska retailers can expect to win the

so-called "border bleed" battle because their retail products will not have those business

taxes hidden in their prices.

5. A retail consumption tax puts Nebraska State Government in the same pricing boat as

Nebraska retailers. If they impose a tax too high, their net revenue will go down as

shoppers go elsewhere. This puts a more effective cap on the cost of government than any

plan driven by Nebraska legislators.

6. EPIC restores property rights to all Nebraska residents by taking away the implicit rent to

the state for their homes, farms and ranches.

As you can see, the Nebraska EPIC proposal leans heavily on the FAIRtax proposal. By

passing this type of legislation at the state level and encouraging other states to do the same,

it will create pressure on the government at the federal level to make the FAIRtax the law of the

land. The more pressure the states create, the better the chances are that the FAIRtax will get passed.

Superman, Spiderman, Wonder Woman, and active seniors — what do they all have in common? Incredible superpowers. Yes, you are a superhero in your own right! While you may not be able to fly or scale buildings, you possess type two muscle fibers (fast twitch) that grant you the power to live life to the fullest in your later years.

Even more concerning, many wellintentioned seniors are missing the mark. Traditional exercise has its benefits, but most do not effectively engage fast-twitch muscle fibers. In fact, some forms of exercise may even accelerate the loss of these fibers.

earlier: Force x Acceleration = Power (type two stimulation). To activate your type two fibers, you need to generate strength quickly and explosively. Think sprinting, jumping, bounding, and leaping. Yes, active seniors can safely perform these activities with the right coaching.

start building type two fibers at any age, although starting sooner is preferable.

Begin today. Regardless of your current fitness level, exercises can be modified to engage your type two muscle fibers provided you have no contraindications to exercise.

For example, try marching as fast as you can from a chair for 30-second intervals, squatting up and down quickly at your kitchen counter for 10 reps, adding 20second running intervals to your daily walk, or performing rapid floor transitions 10 times in under 25 seconds. You can even press a gallon of water overhead explosively for added resistance. You don't need fancy equipment or a gym, just a bit of time. Your daily activities can even be tweaked into type two stimulating movements.

As Spiderman's uncle wisely noted, "with great power, comes great responsibility." However, I prefer to say, "with great responsibility, comes great power." By exercising in a proactive and preventative manner, we can responsibly leverage the superpower of our type two muscle fibers and add life to our years!



supporter of this idea, saying "Accepting help means that we are allowing somebody to bless our lives.

She has also found ways to share that hope with her community. She organizes group activities to create "mental health boxes" for individuals who are struggling or being seen for inpatient mental health care. The boxes contain such things as

reminders of family and loved ones, items to help with daily self-care and positive messages and quotes.

Expert Opinion

The notion of leaning into your community for support is one that's also backed by experts. Dave Eldredge from Huntsman Mental Health Institute says, "The reality is, we all have mental health—just like we all have physical health. And when we take care of our minds, we can show up stronger in our work and for

the people we care about."

Eldredge grew up in both rural Utah and rural Idaho and knows that talking about mental health in rural communities can feel difficult at first. "A big part of the challenge can be our mindset. We pride ourselves on being self-reliant, and that can be a wonderful thing. But when we open up to others for a helping hand or just a listening ear, we can actually be stronger."

the stigma that can sometimes exist with this topic, the "Love, Your Mind" campaign launched a website with free mental health resources






