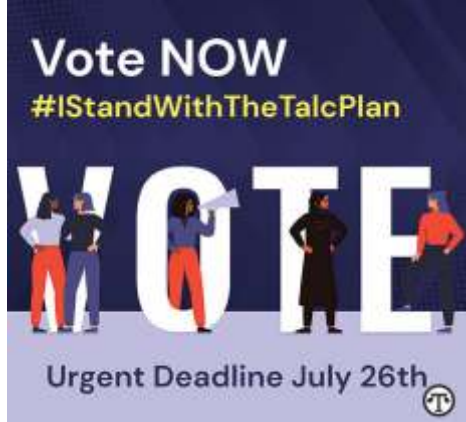
Will they try again? I hope his team protects him!!!

Women With Ovarian Cancer Explain Why They Support Approximately \$8 Billion J&J Talcum Powder Settlement Plan But Time is Running Out for Others to Vote to Support Plan Deadline to Vote is 5pm ET July 26

(NAPS)—Women suffering from ovarian cancer after using Johnson & Johnson's (J&J) talcum powder products want others and their families to know that a critical deadline is approaching for victims of these products. They are urging the tens of thousands who contracted cancer as a result of using J&J talcum powder to take advantage of a unique opportunity and vote for an approximately \$8 billion settlement plan that would resolve years of fruitless litigation.

But time is quickly running out: the vote deadline is 5pm ET on July 26.

Nonnie Hightower, 53, of Milwaukee used J&J baby powder her whole life before getting ovarian cancer.

“We put it on our babies, used it to smell better, even to slip into form-fitting clothes in the 90's! Now I'm angry - for myself, for my daughter, and for my granddaughter. I wonder if I potentially harmed my own family by using baby powder on them. Battling cancer while raising my granddaughter was grueling. I'm supporting this settlement because there are many women waiting for justice, and financially, I need to.”

A group of attorneys from across the country, The Ad Hoc Group of Supporting Counsel, representing more than 77,500 individuals harmed by J&J talcum powder products, is also urging claimants to take immediate action and vote for this historic talcum powder settlement before the deadline.

Under the J&J plan, ovarian cancer clients are likely to receive an average recovery of between \$75,000 and \$150,000, according to the disclosure statement submitted by J&J in support of the plan.

J&J and a subsidiary have agreed to pay approximately \$8 billion over 25 years (\$6.475 billion net present value) to people who were harmed by talcum powder products. The plan provides a way for people to receive compensation without the time and expense of going to trial. But 75% of the claimants voting on the plan must vote to support the plan for it to move ahead.

In 2015 the CEP commissioned an economic impact study of what it means, dollars and cents-wise, to be the Horse Capital. The data was both surprising and impactful.

Equine contributes \$2.6 billion annually to the local economy. That reflects not only the direct spin of the horse farms, shows, and support industries but also the thousands of tourists and guests who visit our community whether for a horse show, thoroughbred auction, or just to view the beautiful farms.

This past year, our friends at the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders & Owners Association updated that study and what an update! Today, the equine industry provides a \$4.3 billion annual impact. Just as in 2015, the industry contributes approximately 1/5 of the area economy. As Ocala has grown, so

has the industry. Perhaps one of the biggest new contributors to this impact is the growth in tourism especially in light of the opening and continual development of the World Equestrian Center.

Farmland Preservation

The CEP is and will continue to be a strong promoter of our Farmland Preservation Area (FPA). Our partners at Horse Farms Forever take the lead in ensuring we can remain the Horse Capital of the World® for generations to come. Maintaining the nearly 200,000-acre FPA is important to us all.

However, that does not mean that either group is anti-growth, just that it needs to occur in the right location. Between FPA, Ocala National Forest, and other government owned/protected lands, *we as a community have basically agreed to preserve 89% of our county*. Approximately 90% of this place we call home is basically off-limits for development or significant development. In other words, virtually all our growth must occur in 1/10th of our land area and most of that should be centered in the Urban Growth Boundary which is 50% smaller than the FPA.

As a community of more than 400,000 residents, this means that the overwhelming majority of development is denser and urbanized. However, this is a small concession to make to ensure we protect this farmland and our springs and forest.

More Rankings

We all know our community is growing. However, we always look forward to sharing rankings from outside entities to verify what we are seeing and experiencing.

PODS, known for their portable moving and storage containers, recently released their Top 20 Cities for Relocation. Ocala has been on this list each of the four years it has been produced. This year, our community moved up two spots to #2. This places us just behind Myrtle Beach/Wilmington and just ahead of Houston. Pretty good company in which to be!

Additionally, Moving Trends released its Top 10 Move-to Cities for the first portion of this year. Not only was Ocala again on the list, but the city ranked #1 with an in-out ratio of 3.32. Translated, this means for 100 people moving out, 332 are moving into our community.

The growth is significant. However, we can and will continue to protect our farmland, forest, and springs while encouraging and supporting growth to create a more prosperous community.

FAIRtax

Instead of being funded by worker's wages, which is a relatively small pool, they will be funded by taxes on overall consumption by all residents.

The FAIRtax provides a progressive program called a prebate. This gives every LEGAL household an advanced refund at the beginning of each month so

that purchases made up to the poverty line level are tax free. This prevents an unfair tax burden being placed on low-income households.

Once an item has been taxed (when new) it is not taxable again eliminating the double and sometimes triple taxation that comes with today's income tax system. You, the American taxpayer, will be in control of how much you pay in taxes through your spending habits not on how much money you make. If you are thrifty, you will pay lower taxes than someone who is not. Tax evasion and the underground economy costs each taxpayer today an additional \$2,500 every year. But by taxing new products and services consumed, the FAIRtax puts everyone in the country on the same level at the cash register.

Under the FAIRtax, the dreaded IRS will no longer be needed. There will be no more complicated tax forms, no individual audits and no intrusive federal bureaucracy requiring you to tell the government more about your financial life than you are willing to tell your own children. Retailers will collect the FAIRtax at the cash register the same as they do now for state sales taxes. They will then submit it to the state taxing authority which will in turn pass it along to the US Treasury. Both the retailers and the states will be paid a fee for their collection services.

solicitation package to determine whether they can vote on the Plan.

Tamika Evans, 47, of Chicago used J&J baby powder daily from age 13 until she was diagnosed with ovarian cancer.

"I thought it was safe and used it to stay dry and during sports. I loved the smell. Now, after five years of chemotherapy and missing out on work and family activities, I'm glad it's no longer for sale. I had to cut back on medical care because it got too expensive. I was forced to quit my job making medical supplies because of being sick. I support this settlement because it's about more than money - it's about acknowledging the impact on our lives."

"It's a highly democratic and efficient process that gives our clients a voice, for the first time, about whether the plan goes through or someone else decides for them," said Anne Andrews, a member of the Ad Hoc Group and Founding and Managing Partner of Newport, CA-based law firm Andrews & Thornton.

Andrews represents Hightower and Evans and more than 10,500 other J&J talc victims. They have waited through years of frustrating and fruitless litigation with the global corporation.

Anna Maria Sanderford, 62, from Florence, Arizona, also represented by Andrews, says her mother used J&J talcum powder on her and her siblings growing up. She used it on her sons and herself as well.

"In the six years since my cancer diagnosis, my recovery has been long and slow. We need to get this settlement done so we can go on with our lives and do what we want with the time we have left. It's especially important for women of my generation who used talcum powder the longest. We're the ones who have suffered the most. I don't want the legal process over a settlement to continue to drag on and use up

even more of my time. I want to enjoy the life I have left."

"Without the settlement through the bankruptcy, it will take decades more for claimants to litigate their cases, with no recovery unless they win," said Andrews. "These women are growing sicker by the day and some have already died while waiting years for justice. I also urge the families who've lost a grandmother, sister, daughter or others to participate on behalf of their loved ones who've already passed away."

Rhonda McKey, 54, of Zachary, Louisiana, another client of Andrews, says baby powder was a part of her life since she was a baby but that now, after battling cancer, her life has completely changed.

"I've gone from being self-employed to being on disability, unable to work as I did before. Now, I'm not able to physically or financially help my family as I had wanted to and planned for. I support this settlement because I've seen companies take years to resolve these issues. For those of us still here, it's important that J&J follows through. I don't want to just survive. I want to live. But it's not just about me—it's for all the women who have suffered, and for the families who have lost loved ones."

Plaintiffs with ovarian cancer cases have lost approximately 95% of cases tried against J&J to date, including every ovarian cancer case brought to trial in the last six years, according to Andrews. "Without the settlement through this plan, it will take decades for claimants to litigate their cases, with no recovery unless they win."

Andrews, Hightower, Evans, Sanderford and McKey urge claimants to take immediate action and vote for this historic talcum powder settlement before the 5pm ET on July 26 deadline by visiting www.OfficialTalcClaims.com or calling 1-888-431-4056 to learn more and request a solicitation package to determine whether they can vote on the Plan.

Ashley Moody urges Senate to pass SAVE Act for election security

Florida Attorney General **Ashley Moody** and a coalition of 22 state attorneys general are urging the U.S.

Senate to pass the Safeguard American Voter Eligibility Act (SAVE Act), which aims to prevent illegal voting by ensuring only American citizens can vote in elections.

“The SAVE Act is crucial legislation that ensures only Americans vote in American elections, and I strongly urge the United States Senate to pass this bill,” Moody said on Tuesday.

The attorneys general sent a letter to congressional leaders expressing concerns that President **Joe Biden's** immigration policies have led to a rise in illegal immigration, which they argue could undermine election security.

The consortium pointed to instances where it was alleged that noncitizens are allowed to vote in local elections and noted that some states, like Arizona, permit noncitizens to vote in federal elections if they register without proof of citizenship.

“The SAVE Act protects our elections from illegal immigrants and upholds the rule of law,” the letter states. “Under the SAVE Act, individuals must provide proof of citizenship when registering to vote.” The act also allows states to access federal databases to identify and remove noncitizens from voter rolls.

Moody's endorsement aligns with Florida's efforts to enhance election security, including requiring proof of citizenship and photo ID for voter registration.

The coalition includes attorneys general from Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, Oklahoma, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, Virginia, West Virginia and Wyoming.

ATTORNEY GENERAL MOODY AND COALITION CALL ON US SENATE TO PASS SAVE ACT TO ENSURE ONLY AMERICANS VOTE IN AMERICAN ELECTIONS

Attorney General Ashley Moody and a coalition of state attorneys general today called on the United States Senate to pass the Safeguard American Voter Eligibility Act, or the SAVE Act, to ensure election integrity by protecting United States elections from illegal voters. The attorneys general call the bill a “common-sense reform” that has broad support among American voters.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “The SAVE Act is important legislation that ensures only Americans vote in American elections, and I along with my colleagues strongly urge the United States Senate to pass this bill.”

In a letter sent to congressional leaders, the attorneys general note, “President Biden's immigration disaster now threatens the security of America's elections. During this surge in illegal immigration, cities and States across the country have started allowing noncitizens to vote in their

elections. But allowing illegal voters in State and local elections, while bad enough, does not remain confined to just those elections. Indeed, some States have taken an even odder approach. Arizona's Secretary of State explains that voters who register to vote without proof of citizenship will be designated 'federal-only' voters, meaning they are allowed to vote in federal, but not state or local, elections.”

The attorneys general go on to say, “The SAVE Act protects our elections from illegal immigrants and upholds the rule of law. Under the SAVE Act, individuals must provide proof of citizenship when registering to vote. The SAVE Act also will help States identify and remove illegal immigrants from their voter registration rolls by providing States with access to federal databases. Those simple, common-sense reforms will protect our elections.”

The 22-state coalition is strongly urging Congress to pass the SAVE Act to provide necessary security and ensure only Americans participate in American elections.

Attorney General Moody is joined by the attorneys general from Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, Oklahoma, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, Virginia, West Virginia and Wyoming.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today announced the 2024 Florida School Resource Officer of the Year, Columbia County Sheriff Deputy Scott Ceckanowicz. Dep. Ceckanowicz has

served as an SRO for six years, is described by peers as being exceptionally attentive and demonstrates a keen awareness of the needs and concerns of both students and staff alike—volunteering after hours to help with school projects.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “School resource officers have a very important role in the safety and wellbeing of our students. The 2024 Florida School Resource Officer of the Year, Deputy Ceckanowicz, goes above and beyond to protect the children where he serves and ensures they have the tools they need to succeed in and out of the classroom. His dedication to the school he serves is unmatched and I am grateful for his service and the example he sets for our students.”

Columbia County Sheriff Mark Hunter said, “Deputy Ceckanowicz's dedication to our School Resource Unit and his passion for students is beyond measure. Everything he does for these kids, he does from the heart, not from obligation, and in doing so, strengthens the trust between the students and law enforcement.”

Known as Deputy Chewy to the students at Melrose Elementary, Dep. Ceckanowicz became a law enforcement officer in 2000 and began working at the Columbia County Sheriff's Office 13 years ago.

Ceckanowicz can be seen giving each student that passes by a high five. Off duty, Dep. [Governor Ron DeSantis Awards More Than \\$12 Million in Northwest Florida Through the Job Growth Grant Fund](#)

PENSACOLA, Fla. — Today, Governor Ron DeSantis awarded funds for workforce

development and infrastructure improvements through the Florida Job Growth Grant Fund (JGGF) and the Defense Infrastructure Grant (DIG). Awards were made to Pensacola State College, the city of DeFuniak Springs, Santa Rosa County, and Jackson County for projects that will support the aviation and aerospace industry, the military and defense industry, and increase access to workforce housing.

“Today's awards will help bring high demand, high wage jobs and businesses to Northwest Florida,” said **Governor Ron DeSantis**. “These strategic investments will benefit Escambia, Walton, Santa Rosa and Jackson counties and provide new opportunities for families from across the Panhandle.”

“Governor DeSantis' focus on catalytic infrastructure and workforce investments, especially in sectors such as manufacturing, aerospace and aviation, and military and defense, will continue to bring job creators and job seekers to Northwest Florida,” said **Secretary of Commerce J. Alex Kelly**. “I'm especially grateful for the Governor's support of the community-driven visions in each of these projects.”

The following entities will receive an award through the Florida Job Growth Grant Fund:

▪ **Pensacola State College (\$4,410,000)** – to establish a new Airframe and Powerplant Mechanics program. This project will support the construction of a new hanger, training equipment, and operating costs for the education program which will be located at the Pensacola Airport.

▪ **DeFuniak Springs (\$3,051,550)** – to construct two 6,400-square-foot hangers, one 10,000-square-foot hanger, a taxiway, an access road, and associated utilities. This infrastructure will allow the airport to attract new innovative employers in aerospace and defense, including Advanced Air Mobility (AAM). The project will create 500 jobs and have a total estimated fiscal impact of more than \$12.3 million.

▪ **Jackson County (\$4,680,059)** – to connect a workforce housing development with an industrial area with a new 1.3-mile, two-lane road. This project will create at least jobs 400 new jobs and has an estimated impact of \$12.5 million. This award builds on more than \$23 million in strategic investments in Jackson County, including more than \$15 million through the Rural Infrastructure Fund, more than \$7 million through the Broadband Opportunity Program, and \$1.5 million through the Florida Small Cities Community Development Block Grant program to encourage job creation, capital investment, and economic development.

The Florida Job Growth Grant Fund is an economic development program designed to promote public infrastructure and workforce training across the state. Proposals are reviewed by FloridaCommerce and are chosen by Governor DeSantis to meet the demands for workforce training or infrastructure needs in

communities around the state.

▪ **Santa Rosa County Whiting Aviation Park – Security Fence Project (\$500,000)** – to create a secure, double-entry gate system connecting NAS Whiting Aviation Park. This will allow aircraft to move safely and efficiently between the base and maintenance area, which will enhance security and maintenance operations. A new electronic gate will also speed up emergency response and provide a secure route for personnel and equipment.

Defense Infrastructure Grants support transportation and access, housing, utilities, communications, and security needs for military communities across the state.

Honoring Our Vietnam Veterans Who Served In Dustoff Crews

I am proud to co-sponsor H.R. 1015, the Dustoff Crews of the Vietnam War Congressional Gold Medal Act. Dustoff crews performed aeromedical evacuations from May 1962 to March 1973, proving to be the difference between life and death for wounded personnel.

Being a Dustoff Crewmember in Vietnam meant a 1 in 3 chance of being wounded or killed. They constantly operated in complete darkness, in bad weather, over mountainous terrain, and braved intense enemy fire.

I'm pleased to join Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers and Rep. Derek Kilmer in this important bill to award these heroes their due.

Defending Our Dairy Farmers

I'm a proud co-sponsor of the DAIRY PRIDE Act, a bill that prohibits the sale of

any food that uses the market name of a dairy product (such as milk, yogurt, or cream cheese) unless the food (1) is the milk of a hooved animal, (2) is derived from such milk, or (3) contains such milk as a primary ingredient.

We're tremendously proud of our dairy products in Florida and support their recognition as what they are: true dairy products.

Protecting Medicaid

I was glad to join my colleagues in signing onto H.R. 7014, the Protect Medicaid Act. The bill prohibits federal payment under Medicaid for the administrative costs of providing health benefits to noncitizens who are ineligible for Medicaid based on their immigration status. American taxpayers shouldn't be on the hook for the health care of those in the country illegally.
