For most people who do not call our state home, when they hear “Florida” they think vacation. In fact, many have suggested half in jest that instead of the Sunshine State our nickname should be the Tourist State. One of the reasons our state can have no state personal income tax or state property tax is because of the tens of millions of tourists who visit our beaches and theme parks. However, many would be surprised to learn that Florida's first commercial tourist attraction was not at an oceanside community or near the big mouse, but here. In Ocala.

Silver Springs was Florida's first commercial tourist attraction. Glass-bottom boats have wowed guests since 1878. Look at the sentence again. Visitors to the Springs

have been riding on glass bottom boats for 146 years! Tourists began arriving by the thousands via steamboat and railroad to tour the must-see Springs. By 1962, more than 1.5 million guests a year visited Silver Springs and ranked as Florida's most visited destination.

The arrival of Walt Disney World in 1971 began a period of rapid decline at Silver Springs. Blame the mouse, blame poor ownership, blame changing interests. Regardless of why, the park drew fewer and fewer tourists and was converted to a state park in 2013. From an economic perspective, tourism has not been a major driver in the local economy since the early 70's. However, that is changing.

New Players, New Opportunities

The arrival of the World Equestrian Center changed everything when it opened in late 2020. The continued growth and development of this truly one-of-a-kind complex is drawing visitors from around the world. The breadth of facilities, hotels, dining, shopping, and entertainment make it truly worthy of its recent designation by

Time as one of the “World's Greatest Places.” When taken with the addition of the Florida Aquatic Swimming and Training facility, our community once again has tourism becoming a driver of the local economy.

How do we know this? One could look at the significant year-over-year increases in the local Tourism Development Tax (bed tax) collections. Another great indicator is the number of new hotels recently opened, under construction, or slated to begin construction soon. By our count, this numbers more than a dozen additional hotels with approximately 1400 rooms. Regardless of how one measures it, tourism is growing.

Silver Springs

So where does that leave our original tourism attraction. The Springs, combined with our other natural attractions - Rainbow Springs, the Forest, Santos Trail, etc. – and our other tourism subsectors (downtown, the arts, and the rest of the equine industry form a great supporting cast). Tourists will come for WEC and stay longer for the horse farms, the downtown square, and a visit to Silver Springs. Improving each of these only makes the rest of the market stronger.

The opportunities for tourism growth at not only Silver Springs but throughout the Ocala Metro is significant. It not only

allows us to share all that we enjoy about our home with others, but it helps to grow and diversify the local economy. Partnering local and state resources and local entrepreneurs is a great way for us to preserve, protect, and promote these great assets.

The IRS is cracking down on more tax cheats this year but failed to enforce this standard on thousands of its employees. While 96% of IRS employees fulfilled their tax obligations last year, a significant share were delinquent, owing nearly \$50 million in taxes to the IRS, a new oversight report found. GOT CAUGHT!

Sen. Joni Ernst (R-IA) is pushing for a regular audit of the Internal Revenue Service after a new inspector general report found that nearly 6,000 employees owe nearly \$50 million in back taxes.

The July 24 report, requested by Ernst and conducted by the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration, found that while 96% of employees were compliant with tax obligations, over 5,800 IRS and contractor employees owed nearly \$50 million in overdue taxes, and only 20 of the

agency's employees who were failing to pay taxes were terminated.

The senator also took issue with a figure in the report that found over 500 former IRS employees with tax compliance issues or performance issues, "including criminal misconduct, sexual misconduct, inability to perform duties, fighting and assault, and unauthorized access to tax return information," were rehired. Of the rehires, 282 had multiple previously documented conduct and performance issues.

So fine that they are invisible to anyone who is unfit for their position or hopelessly stupid. Eager to flaunt these magical garments, the emperor commissions the weavers who proceed to pretend to work at their looms but producing nothing. Fearing to be seen as unfit or stupid, the emperor pretends to see the nonexistent clothing and decides to give a formal parade to show off his new garments.

For a time, all the parade observers are eager to show that they are not stupid so they exclaimed how wonderful the emperor's new clothes seem. However the ruse is exposed when a child points out to his mother that the emperor is wearing nothing at all. Hearing the child, others begin to say the same thing and the embarrassed emperor is hurried back to his castle.

FROM THE DESK OF ATTORNEY GENERAL MOODY



Leaders to Inform the Public About How to Report Voter Registration Fraud

Attorney General Ashley Moody today in Orlando encouraged vigilance in spotting and reporting voter fraud at the Florida Tax Collectors Association Annual Conference. Tax collector offices around the state are where Floridians go to interact face to face with government. In Florida, tax collectors are independent constitutional officers duly elected by registered voters.

These county government leaders do more than collect taxes. In tax collector offices, Floridians can receive vehicle tags, hunting licenses, driver's licenses and even submit voter registration forms. With the 2024 presidential election around the corner, Attorney General Moody is encouraging tax collectors to display information about reporting voter registration crimes to Florida's Voter Fraud Hotline: 1(877)868-3737.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "For many Floridians, tax collectors are the face of the government. Tax collectors help them obtain their first driver's license and can even help them register to vote. Florida has taken great steps to ensure the integrity of our elections. Today, I encouraged tax collectors to help us keep Florida elections secure by posting information about Florida's Voter Fraud Hotline—so Floridians know how and where to report suspicious activity."

In 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis created the Florida Department of State's Office of Election Crimes and Security to conduct preliminary investigations into irregularities or fraud involving voter registration, voting, candidate or issue petition activities, or any other alleged violations of Florida's Election Code. According to the website, OECS has reviewed and investigated more than 3,000 complaints and allegations of election fraud. Additionally, OECS has initiated more than 1,300 independent investigations.

At the annual conference, Attorney General Moody asked tax collectors to post the OECS information in offices across the state, so Floridians know where and how to report illegal voter registration. The call follows efforts by Attorney General Moody to encourage elected leaders to provide the public with information to anonymously report criminal activity through **TIPS and display other public-safety messages aimed at spotting and preventing consumer fraud.

As Colleges and Universities Begin a New Academic Year, AG Moody Advises Higher Education Officials About Legal Protections and Shared Commitment to Jewish Students in Florida

As colleges and universities begin a new academic year, Attorney General Ashley Moody today sent a reminder to higher education officials in Florida about their duty to protect Florida's Jewish students from harassment, intimidation and other incidents of antisemitism. The reminder comes in the wake of radical antisemitic protests continuing around the nation and following the destructive protests witnessed

at colleges and universities in the previous academic year.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Last year, my office circulated a memo advising higher education officials of the zero-tolerance policy for antisemitism in our state. Florida offered an example to the rest of the country with swift action while other states witnessed their colleges and universities overtaken by chaos and, in some instances, crime. Let this serve as a reminder, there is no room in our state for lawlessness or antisemitism. As a new school year begins, we are renewing our commitment to making Florida a safe state for Jewish students."

The letter states, "In the days and months following the horrific October 7 attacks on Israel, America saw university administrators across the country utterly fail to protect Jewish students and maintain law and order. Many schools allowed encampments and demonstrations to disrupt student life and school operations...Some of these schools even tolerated overt acts of antisemitic harassment and violence. And because school administrators allowed this unconscionable conduct to continue throughout the entire school year, some universities were forced to cancel graduation ceremonies."

The letter points out that in Florida, schools stood by Jewish students and ensured that Florida's campuses remained institutions of education, "instead of cesspools of lawlessness and hate."

Attorney General Moody goes on to remind school officials that there are legal risks for colleges and universities if they fail to uphold protections for Jewish students. "I also want to advise you that failing to protect Jewish students would create significant legal risk for Florida colleges and

universities. For example, a federal court in California recently entered an injunction against UCLA after the court found that 'Jewish students were excluded from portions of the UCLA campus because they refused to denounce their faith,' a fact the court called 'unimaginable' and 'abhorrent to our constitutional guarantee of religious freedom.' Such failures may also put federal funding at risk."

Attorney General Moody Urges Older Floridians to Watch Out for Fraud Ahead of National Senior Citizens Day

Ahead of National Senior Citizens Day, Attorney General Moody is asking older Floridians to watch out for fraud. Florida is home to more than 5.5 million seniors. Attorney General Moody is highlighting efforts to protect these Floridians from fraudulent schemes. After taking office in 2019, Attorney General Moody launched Florida's Senior Protection Team, an intra-agency group of experts working together to fight fraud. Last year, the team secured more than \$1 million in financial relief for Florida seniors.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Florida may be known as the Sunshine State, but we are also a silver state—and we prioritize protecting those who choose to live out their golden years here. “With today’s launch of Activate Hope, we can now bring Hope Florida directly to a community in exceptional need—like those dealing with the impacts of a storm,” said First Lady Casey DeSantis. “This new Hope Florida expansion will ensure that in the future, Floridians impacted by storms or

other emergency situations can readily connect with Hope Navigators and receive the help, services, and supplies they need. On the flip side, Hope Florida can rally communities and empower them to help their fellow Floridians in need, especially during a disaster.”

“Thanks to the leadership and dedication of Governor and First Lady DeSantis, we prepare our residents and prioritize the resiliency of our communities year-round and with partnerships not seen anywhere else in the nation,” said Florida Division of Emergency Management Executive Director Kevin Guthrie. “Activate Hope is another example of how the state continues to innovate our disaster response and recovery practices, and FDEM is proud to support the recovery of those in need with this program.”

Through Activate Hope, Florida will expand the reach of Hope Florida, adding a box truck and an additional ADA-accessible Hope Bus. This expansion will increase the capacity for Hope Florida to join the efforts of the Florida Division of Emergency Management at their Points of Distribution sites, State Business Recovery Centers, and Multi-Agency Resource Centers across the state. Hope Navigators and volunteers from state agencies will be on-site after a storm to distribute needed supplies, such as food, water, baby supplies, cleaning supplies, etc., and offer Hope Navigation services.

Additionally, Governor Ron DeSantis and First Lady Casey DeSantis announced that a new toll-free Hope Line at 833-GET-HOPE is active today for Floridians seeking help to call. You can call Hope Florida’s Hope Line

to speak with a Hope Navigator who can help identify barriers to success, such as lack of resources, skills, opportunities, or basic necessities. This line will also be used as a part of Activate Hope to help connect Floridians with outside resources to provide food, household goods, home repairs, and more.

Hope Navigators help individuals identify their needs, develop long-term goals, map out a path forward, and work to ensure all sectors of the community have a ‘seat at the table’ to be part of a lasting solution. In two years since Hope Florida’s launch in July 2022, nearly 30,000 Floridians have reduced their reliance upon or are no longer reliant on government assistance—a reduction which is estimated to save the State of Florida nearly \$800 million over the next decade.

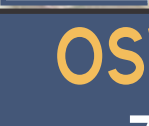
