

about the local economy and what drives it, there are a few industries which immediately come to mind. We are the Horse Capital of the World® and know that equine

plays a big part of the local economy. Others may think about how our community has become a major logistics center for the state and all of the new big box distribution centers which have been built near the interstate. Some may go to Ocala's long-time role as a major manufacturing center, home to companies like Lockheed Martin, REV Fire – EONE, Pella, Cardinal Glass, etc. However, the sector that employs the most people and some of the highest wages is healthcare.

Regional Healthcare Center

It might be easy for one to overlook the size and scale of the local healthcare industry. While one may look at Gainesville and see the significance of the industry there because of the near omnipresence of the

University and UF Health, our market is different. Here we have three different yet significant healthcare providers who all have made and are making substantial investments. When combined these three providers are the backbone of arguably our largest economic driver.

AdventHealth can trace its roots back locally to the real beginning of local healthcare with their 2018 purchase of what had been Munroe Regional Hospital. Today, AdventHealth Ocala is our largest hospital by beds with 425. In addition to the main downtown hospital, the system operates two free standing ERs in Belleview and TimberRidge, a Care Pavilion at Heath Brook, and a number of other facilities across the community. They are currently building a 60,000 sq. ft. medical office building on their downtown campus. Additionally, we are excited to watch them launch a Graduate Medical Education program in the very near future.

HCA operates two rapidly expanding hospital in the Ocala Metro: HCA Ocala downtown and HCA West Marion. Today, HCA Ocala has 323 beds and HCA West Marion has 236 beds. Combined, the two hospitals have nearly 3200 employees. The downtown hospital is the area's Level 1

Trauma Center and has hosted the company's Graduate Medical Education program since 2017. Each year the program hosts approximately 165 residents in a range of specialties including Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine, and Family Medicine among others. Over the last few years, HCA has invested more than \$1 billion in the local market

The newest entrant to the local is UF Health. Earlier this year, the company cut the ribbon on their new 150,000 sq. ft. Ocala Neighborhood Hospital. This facility serves patients through 10 inpatient rooms, four operating rooms, 12 pre and post operative beds, an imaging center, and a 10 room ER. Additionally, patients can receive outpatient lab draws, other pre-operative services, and rehab services with both Occupational and Physical Therapies.

Sphere

The Healthcare sector is so important to the local economy that the CEP launched the Sphere initiative in 2020. This initiative, sponsored by Empath Home Health, focuses on growing and supporting our healthcare economy by bringing all the industry's segments together to collaborate and communicate. Erin Jones on our team leads this effort and does a great job not only supporting the local healthcare community but works to recruit additional businesses to expand the healthcare economy.



Bonuses for Law Enforcement

Florida Awards 300 New Bonuses for Law Enforcement Recruits, Reaching 6,400 Total

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Today, Governor Ron DeSantis announced that Florida is making 300 new bonus awards to Law Enforcement Officers and has reached a

milestone of 6,400 bonuses awarded to new law enforcement recruits through the Florida Law Enforcement Recruitment Bonus Payment Program. The latest 300 bonuses were awarded to officers serving in counties impacted by Hurricanes Debby, Helene, and Milton. This first-of-its-kind initiative, launched in 2022, is part of Florida's strongest-in-the-nation support for law enforcement and constitutes a one-time, \$5,000 bonus—after taxes—to newly employed officers in the state.

"Florida welcomes law enforcement officers from across the country to a state where they will be recognized and appreciated," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "Additionally, Florida celebrates the law enforcement profession and encourages people to join the force. Law enforcement officers make enormous personal sacrifices for the communities they serve, and they deserve higher pay and more support."

To date, more than 1,560 law enforcement officers from 49 other states and two territories have relocated to Florida, with more than 470 coming from anti-police states like California, Illinois, and New York. Each of the 6,400 newly recruited officers has received a \$5,000 bonus after taxes, with the program distributing more than \$43.3 million to date.



(NewsUSA) - The United States is poised for global leadership in the area of AI and robotics as discussed at the AI+ Robotics Summit hosted by the Special Competitive Studies Project (SCSP), a nonprofit and nonpartisan initiative with a goal of making recommendations to strengthen America's long-term competitiveness in AI. The sessions highlighted significant technological advancements and outlined ways to achieve and maintain global leadership, said SCSP in a recent newsletter. Key takeaways regarding AI and robotics identified at the summit include:

- made well! Another consideration, the 1. Advances in AI have enabled robotics to move from physics-based problems to natural language solutions. The next generation of robots will be powered in part by LLMs, simulation computers, and ondevice robotic foundation models.
 - 2. Using AI in simulation environments to model robot interactions at machine scale. Gathering simulation and real-world data would allow robots to expand beyond factories and warehouses.
 - 3. Future factories will be highly automated due to advanced manufacturing. Factories are the testing ground for innovation in AIenabled robotics. These advances will also support a transformation across industries ranging from ag-riculture to medicine to construction.
 - 4. Brainstorming "moonshot" ideas. Players from all parts of the U.S. robotics ecosystem could get behind big ideas that would fuel the U.S. robotics ecosystem to technological advantage, such as investing in robotics supply chains and leveraging AI-enabled robots to search for life in outer space.
 - 5. Taking advantage of voluntary publicprivate partnerships. Today's AI and robotics innovations are driven by the private sector, but partnerships can help bridge technology gaps, strengthen supply chains, and address workforce challenges.
 - 6. Promoting private investment in hardware. The U.S. government can reduce the risk for private investment in robotics production at scale with incentives such as tax credits.
 - 7. Embracing new jobs. Placing AI at the center of learning will educate the next generation workforce with new skills to adapt to an evolving technology landscape.
 - 8. Accelerating learning, mapping, and cooperating on robotics with allies. The U.S. should work with partner nations to foster structural cooperation on shared programs.
 - 9. Catching up to China's industrial robotics. China has aggressively adopted new technologies for robotics in manufacturing. These investments and initiatives pose a competitive challenge to
 - 10. Bringing robotics to the forefront of U.S. technology strategies. China has outcompeted the U.S. in robotics and the lack of a national strategy illustrates how it is a secondary consideration.

The campaigns are over and we have a new President. How could this effect our efforts to push the FAIRtax ahead? President Trump has promised no tax on tips, Social Security and overtime. There have also been leaks from his campaign that he is also looking into a national sales tax, the elimination of the income tax and the repeal of the 16th Amendment. This is all

good news.

President Trump has floated the idea of using tariffs to replace the income tax but the FAIRtax is much more economically efficient than tariffs. While tariffs do bring money into the federal treasury, they are more suited to enforcing fair trade between countries than for raising revenue. The FAIRtax however, was specifically designed to replace the income tax in funding the government.

Unfortunately the DC elites and many members of Congress in both parties will work feverishly to retain the present income/payroll tax system. These people have used the income tax system for decades to raise large amounts of money for their reelection campaigns and to exert control over our lives by giving tax breaks to those who

will do their bidding and tax penalties to those who don't. They also love having the power of the IRS at their disposal to punish those who dare to oppose their agenda with higher taxes and IRS audits. They won't give up easily.

- 4) it will once again hide the true cost of government from the American taxpayer



AG Moody's Office of Statewide Prosecution Charges Tax Preparer with **Money Laundering** and Fraud for Stealing from **Seniors**

TALLAHASSEE,

Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody's Office of Statewide Prosecution is charging a tax preparer with multiple felony counts for scheming to defraud Floridians, many of whom are seniors. The Broward Sheriff's Office arrested Ricardo Karns for using his tax preparation business to defraud at least 21 unsuspecting victims — 19 of whom are seniors. Karns operated Karns Taxes & Investments and obtained the personal identification information of nonclients and fraudulently used the information to open credit card accounts in the victims' names. Once obtaining the fraudulent credit cards, Karns used the cards at Karns Taxes & Investments, making it appear that the victims purchased the tax preparation service.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "This tax preparer stole personal information to defraud Florida seniors. He tried to launder his ill-gotten gains, funneling the stolen funds through his tax business — where he spent countless hours executing his illegal scheme. Now, my Statewide Prosecutors will make sure he pays for his crimes with an extended stay at a taxpayer-funded facility."

According to the law enforcement investigation, Karns transferred funds from

Karns Taxes & Investments to a separate account or withdrew the funds in the form of cash. The investigation also revealed that some of the fraudulently obtained credit cards showed transactions being conducted at businesses owned by Karns' associates.

Karns is charged with one count of money laundering, 16 counts of criminal use of personal identification information, 19 counts of grand theft of a person 65 years or older and three counts of grand theft.

Charge Members of Organized Retail Theft Ring for Committing More Than 35 Thefts in South Florida

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody's Office of Statewide Prosecution is charging three members of an organized crime ring with multiple felony counts for stealing from retailers in South Florida. According to a Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office investigation, Ariel McFarlane, Lequentin Butler and Eddy Etienne committed more than 35 thefts in Palm Beach and Broward counties in a fourmonth period. The group targeted major retailers and stole items from laundry detergent to fragrances and expensive clothing.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "All the laundry detergent and perfume in stench of guilt emanating from these against current and former Federal

organized retail thieves. They committed more than 35 thefts from multiple retailers in South Florida, stealing more than \$15,000 worth of laundry detergent, fragrances and the fraudulent transactions conducted at expensive clothing. Now, my statewide prosecutors will make sure they pay for this four-month crime spree spanning multiple counties.'

According to the investigation, between January and April, McFarlane, Butler and Etienne committed more than 35 thefts from retail and department stores in South organized scheme to defraud, two counts of Florida. The group stole laundry detergent, laundry products, fragrances and expensive clothing from stores including CVS, Walgreens, Publix, Nordstrom and Bloomingdale's. After completing the thefts, OSP Statewide Prosecutors Sophia the group posted the stolen goods for sale online through McFarlane's Facebook Marketplace page and Instagram. The trio then delivered the stolen products to AG Moody's Statewide Prosecutors customers in Palm Beach and Broward counties in McFarlane's vehicle.

> Each of the three defendants are charged with conspiracy to commit racketeering, organized retail theft and unlawful use of two-way communications devices. McFarlane and Butler are also charged with dealing in stolen property. Additionally, Etienne is charged with grand theft.

Etienne is currently in the country on a green card and is still at large.

Attorney General Moody's Assistant Statewide Prosecutors Chris Olowin and Kristin Howe will handle the case.

The legal complaint outlines the terrible facts of the civil rights violations following the devastation caused by Hurricanes Helene and Milton. The complaint includes a message from Washington directing workers to "avoid homes advertising Trump."



(NewsUSA) - One in three active-duty families of color have turned down military assignments due to concerns about racism or lack of inclusion in local communities, according to research from Blue Star Families' Campaign for Inclusion. For twothirds of these service members, declining orders led to negative career impacts - and for 15%, it was career-ending.

down assignments due to community concerns, it impacts not just family wellbeing but our national security," said Kathy Roth-Douquet, CEO of Blue Star Fami-lies. "With most recruitable U.S. adults projected to be people of color within five years, creating truly inclusive communities isn't just the right thing to do — it's essential for maintaining our All-Volunteer Force."

The latest research from Blue Star Families' Campaign for Inclusion examined how communities can better support diverse military families through case studies of three distinct military communities: Hill Air cultural integration. Force Base (Utah), San Antonio (Texas, "Military City USA"), and Hampton Roads (Virginia).

Key findings reveal that both formal systems (like community resources and programs) and informal networks (neighbors and local connections) are and retain the force we need." foundational for military families developing a sense of belonging. Having multiple shared identities — from military affiliation to cultural background strengthens these connections.

The research found that individual acts of welcome — from neighbors introducing themselves to communities providing culturally relevant services — make the

biggest difference in helping military families feel at home. For example, San Blue Star Families' 'Campaign for Antonio's military spouse employment Inclusion' Research Shows Inclusive programs and Hampton Roads' diverse cultural resources demonstrate how communities can create infrastructure supporting inclusion.

Building on this, here are five ways individuals and communities can activate to support local military and Veter-an families.
