

FBI's Ten Most Wanted



The Lady Lake Police Department is proud to announce the arrest of Donald Eugene Fields II, one of the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives. Fields II was apprehended Saturday, Jan. 26, following a routine traffic stop conducted by Lady Lake Police Sgt. Michelle Bilbrey. The arrest took place at approximately 9:15 a.m. at the intersection of U.S. Highway 27/441 and Rolling Acres Road.

Sgt. Bilbrey discovered that the vehicle's license plate was not registered to the car Fields was driving. This proactive policing effort resulted in the identification and capture of Fields, who is facing federal charges of child sex trafficking and state charges of child rape. Fields had been added to the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list in May 2023.

Lady Lake Police Chief Steve Hunt commended Sgt. Bilbrey and the department for outstanding work. "Sometimes, an everyday traffic stop turns into a real game-changer. This is a reminder that every officer, every day, is out there making a real difference," said Chief Hunt. "Every traffic stop is an opportunity for justice. What starts as a routine encounter can quickly turn into a pivotal moment, where an officer's sharp instincts and dedication to service lead to a significant arrest—keeping our community and in this case, the nation, safer."

The FBI also praised the efforts of the Lady Lake Police Department. Special Agent in Charge Ashley Johnson remarked, "Thanks to proactive policing by the Lady Lake Police Department, one of the FBI's Ten Most Wanted fugitives has been captured." Chief Hunt, an FBI National Academy graduate, expressed his gratitude

for the ongoing collaboration between the FBI and local law enforcement.

Fields, 60, was federally indicted in St. Louis on Dec. 7, 2023, for attempting to recruit and exploit a minor for commercial sex acts between January 2013 and June 2017. He also faces state charges in Missouri, including statutory rape, statutory sodomy, child molestation, and witness tampering. Fields has been a fugitive since March 2022 when he failed to appear for a court hearing in Franklin County, Missouri.

Following his arrest, Fields will be scheduled to make his first appearance in federal court in Florida.

The Lady Lake Police Department remains committed to serving and protecting our community while supporting efforts to hold offenders accountable for their actions. This arrest underscores the importance of vigilance and dedication in everyday policing.

Lady Lake named Tree City USA for 20th year

LADY LAKE - For the 20th year, Lady Lake has been named a Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation. To receive the prestigious designation, a Tree City must have a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, a community forestry program with an annual budget of at least \$2 per capita and on Arbor Day observation and proclamation.

According to Tree City USA, a commitment to tree helps lead to cooler temperatures, cleaner air, higher property values and healthier residents.

"It is a great honor to receive Tree City USA designation for the 20th year," said Parks and Recreation Director Mike Burske. "It represents our dedication to protecting the town's historic trees and collaborating with residents to plant and nurture new ones, creating a lasting legacy for future generations."

Together with community partners, Lady Lake plants trees annually at various locations during its Arbor Day celebration

every April. In 2024, the town joined Lake County in planting several trees outside Lake County Fire Station 52 in Lady Lake.

The Town hosts a tree raffle annually, offering winners \$200 gift certificates to purchase trees at a local nursery. The Lady Lake Tree Raffle is made possible by the town's tree bank, which is funded by developers who are required to donate if they cannot meet the town's stringent tree code.

The Town's land development regulations require developers to put money into the town's tree bank to mitigate any tree loss. This is a way in which the town enforces responsible development and tree conservation.

The Department proudly recognized several officers for their outstanding contributions and service to the community. Chief Steve Hunt reflected on the department's growth and success in overcoming recent challenges.

"The department was at a crossroads not long ago," said Chief Hunt. "Thanks to the unwavering support of Mayor Freeman, the Town Commission, and Town Manager Lawrence, we've been able to not only retain

our valued officers but also attract top talent from across the nation. This has ensured our ability to continue providing the high level of service our residents deserve."

The highlight of the evening was the presentation of awards recognizing the exceptional efforts of the department's team, including:

Officer Joshua Higgins and Sergeant Heather Couch: Meritorious Service Award for actions that saved a life. They were able to de-escalate a situation with a suicidal caller and convinced the individual to surrender a fully loaded handgun, saving his life.

Scott Kolb, Evidence Technician: Certificate of Appreciation for significant contributions to the evidence management system.

Robert Chausse, Training Officer/Quartermaster: Certificate of Appreciation for his role in implementing new programs, including dash cameras, body-worn cameras, new Tasers, a firearm transition project, and the updated Field Training Officer management program, while maintaining ongoing duties.

"Our goal is to set the standard for what a great police department should look like—embodying integrity, respect, and dedication in all that we do," said Chief Hunt.

Chief Hunt also introduced eight new officers who joined the department in 2024, leaving just one position of a total 30 sworn officers to be filled. FAIRTAX



Unlawful emigration has been in the news for a long time and some have asked me how

will the FAIRtax help or hinder the control of illegals flooding into our country. Perhaps I can explain how it will help stem the flow of illegals. Remember, the FAIRtax REPLACES the federal income tax and payroll tax system with a national retail sales tax plus a prebate which makes spending up to the poverty level tax free.

This means that those living at or below the poverty level will pay the FAIRtax rate of zero percent. A person spending twice the poverty level would pay a spending tax rate of 11.5%, a person spending three times the poverty level would pay an effective rate of 17.3%, and so on. Your tax rate is determined by you and by how you spend. The FAIRtax will, for the first time, tax undocumented workers who now evade the income and payroll taxes.

Under the FAIRtax, all persons living in

the United States will pay taxes, whether they are here legally or illegally. Under the current system, many illegals do not pay income and payroll taxes even though they are here earning wages and are legally required to do so. They may also be receiving benefits in the form of health care, education, housing, roads and much more.

Under the FAIRtax, both lawful and unlawful residents will pay taxes when they purchase new goods and services for consumption here; however, only lawful residents are eligible to receive the FAIRtax prebate which effectively eliminates taxes on spending up to the poverty level. Unlawful residents will be paying a rate of 23 cents on every dollar they spend since they are not eligible for the prebate.

The only way to get the prebate is to become a legal resident or citizen. In this way, the FAIRtax helps promote legal emigration. It also ensures that unlawful residents contribute to the cost of providing the services they receive. For more information please go to FAIRtax.org






AG Moody Releases New Scams at a Glance: Grandparent Grifts Resource During Senior Protection Event

Attorney General Ashley Moody

today hosted a Senior Scam Seminar at the On Top of the World Cultural Center in Marion County and released a new senior-protection resource. Attended by more than 500 Florida seniors, the educational symposium focused on senior fraud and how to avoid becoming a victim of cybercrime and schemes related to cryptocurrency, financial crime and exploitation. At the symposium, Attorney General Moody released *Scams at a Glance: Grandparent Grifts*. This new resource aims to help Florida seniors know how to avoid and properly report grandparent schemes. In these schemes, imposters pose as a grandchild and call a target claiming to be in an emergency situation and then request money.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Today, we held a Senior Scam Seminar to educate hundreds of older Floridians about common and emerging scams. During the seminar, we released our *Scams at a Glance: Grandparents Grifts*. This new resource explains grandparent scams and provides tips to help older Floridians spot and avoid these imposter scams."

Joining Attorney General Moody as speakers at the Senior Scam Seminar were Marion County Sheriff Billy Woods, representatives from the State Attorney's Office from the 5th Judicial Circuit and Marion County Sheriff's Office's Fraud Team, as well as representatives from Attorney General Moody's Cyber Fraud Enforcement Unit, Seniors vs Crime and Senior Protection Teams.

Grandparent scams begin with a call from someone pretending to be the grandchild of a target. The schemer may speak softly or make an excuse for sounding different. The scammer, posing as the victim's grandchild, will then claim to be in trouble and need money. The fraudster may urgently demand payment and beg the senior to keep it a secret. Once the victim sends money to the scammer, victims are often unable to get the money back.

To help combat grandparent scams, Attorney General Moody is releasing *Scams at a Glance: Grandparent Grifts*. The resource offers the following tips:

- Resist the urge to act immediately. Hang up and check with the grandchild or other family members directly;
- Know that anyone demanding payment in the form of a gift card, cryptocurrency or wire transfer is probably a scammer — never send money to solicitors through these means;
- Be aware that scammers may use information found on a victim's family members' social media platforms to appear credible; and
- Scammers may request to meet and receive the money in person. If this

happens, hang up and call local law enforcement immediately.

Following Report Showing Alarming Increase in Hate Crimes Against Jewish Floridians, AG Moody to Host Law Enforcement Training to Combat Antisemitism

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Following the latest Hate Crimes in Florida Report showing an alarming increase in hate crimes against Jewish Floridians, Attorney General Ashley Moody will be hosting a law enforcement training to address antisemitism on college campuses. The recently released report detailed an alarming 94% increase in hate crimes against Jewish Floridians from 2022 to 2023. The report also noted that the Jewish community has been increasingly targeted on college campuses since the Hamas terrorist attack on Israel in October 2023. Florida stands with the nation's ally, Israel, and Attorney General Moody is proud to announce an upcoming training designed to help law enforcement and investigators combat hate crimes and antisemitism on college campuses.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Florida is a law-and-order state, and we

have taken extraordinary steps to protect the Jewish community since the October 7th attacks. While law enforcement continues to vigilantly protect Jewish Floridians, we are seeing an increase in reported antisemitic hate crimes. That is why we are hosting a training to help combat antisemitism on college campuses."

Following the Oct. 7, 2023, terrorist attacks on Israel, antisemitic incidents [more than tripled](#) across the United States. The epicenter of much of the antisemitic activity is college and university campuses. Attorney General Moody previously reached out to higher education officials in 2023 and 2024 advising them of Florida's zero-tolerance policy against antisemitism and provided information on state statutes that outlaw antisemitic hate crimes and supporting terrorist organizations.

Florida Graduation Rate Breaks State Record at 89.7%

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Today, Governor Ron DeSantis announced that Florida's high school graduation rate rose to 89.7 percent during the 2023-2024 school year, an increase of 1.7 percentage points over last year, exceeding the pre-pandemic rate of 86.9% for the 2018-2019 school year. The 2023-2024 high school graduation rate represents the highest rate in Florida history, with the exception of the pandemic school years 2019-20 and 2020-21, in which graduating classes were exempt from statewide, standardized assessment requirements stipulated in state law.

"Florida leads the nation in education because we put education over indoctrination, empower parents, and have made school choice universal," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "This record graduation rate is a prime metric of our success, in addition to our #1-in-the-nation rating."

"Florida's graduation rate continues to climb," said Florida Department of Education Commissioner Manny Diaz, Jr. "Florida is number one for education because of our commitment to providing a quality education that fits the needs of each student, and our climbing graduation rate is proof positive that our approach is working. Under the leadership of Governor DeSantis, Florida will continue to lead the nation in educational success."

Highlights from Florida's 2023-2024 high school graduation rate include:

- The 2023-24 graduation rate rose to 89.7 percent, an increase of 1.7 percentage points over last year and 2.4 percentage points from 2021-22.

- African American students' graduation rate rose 2.1 percentage points over last year, and 3.3 percentage points since 2021-22.

- Hispanic students' graduation rate increased by 2.2 percentage points from last year and 3.1 percentage points over 2021-22.

- The graduation rate for students with disabilities rose 1.3 percentage points over last year and 3.3 percentage points from 2021-22.

- Economically disadvantaged students' graduation rate rose 2.4 percentage points over last year and 3.1 percentage points from 2021-22.

- English Language learners' graduation rate improved 4.6 percentage points over last year and 7.7 percentage points since 2021-22.

Under Governor Ron DeSantis, Florida's graduation rate has increased significantly, moving from 70.6% to the record high rate of 89.7 in 2023-2024.

Governor Ron DeSantis Announces Proposals for Immigration Special Session

Governor Ron DeSantis announced proposals for Florida's upcoming Special Legislative Session. The proposed actions will position Florida to quickly carry out

President-Elect Donald Trump's mandate to combat illegal immigration.

"Florida is ready to lead," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "With President Trump taking office, Florida has a unique opportunity to help facilitate the end to America's immigration crisis."

Proposed legislation includes:

- Mandate maximum participation in the 287(g) deportation program, with penalties for non-compliance, including suspension of officials;
- Establish a state crime for entering the U.S. illegally and a process for self-deportation;
- Appoint a dedicated officer to oversee coordination with federal authorities and the Unauthorized Alien Transport Program (UATP);
- Expand UATP to detain and facilitate the deportation of illegal aliens from the U.S.;
- Broaden the legal definition of gang-related activities to include more groups of dangerous illegal aliens;
- Repeal in-state college tuition for illegal immigrant students;
- Require voter registration affirmation of U.S. citizenship and Florida residency;
- Increase penalties for unauthorized aliens committing voter fraud or providing false voter registration information;
- Mandate identity verification for foreign remittance transfers; and
- Create a rebuttable presumption that illegal aliens are flight risks and deny bail.

Governor Ron DeSantis and First Lady Casey DeSantis Establish Hope Florida Office within the Executive Office of the Governor

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.— Governor Ron DeSantis and First Lady Casey DeSantis established the Hope Florida Office within the Executive Office of the Governor to oversee and administer the growing Hope Florida Pathway to Prosperity Initiative. Established in 2021, Hope Florida is a first-of-its-kind initiative that maximizes support from community partners outside government—predominantly non-profits, faith-based organizations, and private sector business partners. Utilizing a personalized navigation model, Floridians seeking government assistance are provided a Hope Navigator who utilizes those aforementioned entities to meet immediate needs and guide them on a Pathway to economic self-sufficiency. In fact, Hope Florida has already led to more than **30,000** Floridians decreasing or eliminating reliance on public assistance. Estimates show that Hope Florida could save taxpayers nearly \$1 billion dollars over the next 10 years. Under the Hope Florida model, government serves as a convener and collaborator between good people who need help and good people, outside of government, who are willing to help. Government is uniquely positioned to make the connection and thus reduce its role in assisting people in need, while also providing preventative navigation that aims to prevent Floridians from reentering or becoming dependent on the "government

system."

Celia, a mother of three, was a graduate student who was struggling with student loans, rent, and childcare. While deciding between leaving school and applying for government assistance, Celia was introduced to Hope Florida. Through Hope Florida, Celia was connected with daycare resources, enabling her to finish school and land a full-time job. Her Hope Navigator encouraged her to continue her education and helped her develop a sustainable financial plan.

"Hope Florida is the alternative to government dependency," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "Thanks to Hope Florida, Floridians will receive better services that lead to self-sufficiency through this one-of-a-kind program."

"Hope Florida is revolutionizing the way state governments meet needs," said First Lady DeSantis. "By bringing together existing resources outside of government and pairing those in need with a navigator to guide them through all of the available help, Hope Florida is using government as the connector and then getting out of the way. In short, Hope Florida is help finding help."

Since Hope Florida's creation in 2021, more than 150 Hope Navigators across the state have referred over **100,000** Floridians for assistance, established **5,600** Hope Florida partners, including over **2,000** faith-based partners into the Hope Florida network.

The newly established Hope Florida office within the Executive Office of the Governor will work closely with state agencies to deepen partnerships with the public and private sectors to optimize Hope Florida's effectiveness across the state. Erik Dellenback, who currently serves as the Governor's Liaison for Faith and Community, will lead the Hope Florida office as Executive Director.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to serve in this new role, but more importantly to steward the bold vision of the Governor and First Lady for Hope Florida," said Erik Dellenback. "Through Hope Florida, I believe we are standing witness to an incredible model of simple yet profound connection that will change our state and sweep across the nation."

In August, Governor DeSantis and First Lady Casey DeSantis announced "Activate Hope," an expansion of Hope Florida to serve Floridians recovering from the impacts of disasters.

Governor Ron DeSantis Announces School Choice Success

JACKSONVILLE, Fla.— Governor Ron DeSantis announced Florida has surpassed 500,000 students participating in Florida's school choice scholarship program. Additionally, more than 30,000 students are participating in the New Worlds Scholarship Accounts Program, with an additional 18,000 students utilizing the transportation stipend created by House Bill 1 (2023).

"Florida is the number one state for education because of our commitment to providing every student with the option that works best for them," said Governor Ron DeSantis. "I am proud that we have enabled over 500,000 students to access a high-quality education that fits their individual needs."

"Under Governor DeSantis' leadership, Florida continues to lead the way in providing the best educational opportunities for every student.," said Florida Department of Education Commissioner of Education Manny Diaz, Jr. "I am proud to see how many Florida families we are helping through school choice programs."

In 2023, Governor DeSantis signed House Bill 1 (HB 1), which established universal school choice. The bill eliminated financial eligibility restrictions and the enrollment cap for the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options. HB 1 also increased the annual scholarship cap growth for the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Unique Abilities and created a new opportunity for Florida students not enrolled full time in a public or private school to participate in the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program through a parent-directed Personalized Education Program. Additionally, HB 1 added a transportation stipend to the Florida Empowerment Scholarship Program.

In total, nearly 1.4 million students are utilizing a school choice option in Florida. Highlights of participation in Florida's school choice programs for 2024-25 include:

- More than 524,000 scholarships awarded under the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (FTC), Florida Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES EO) and the Florida Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Disabilities (FES UA)
- 107,000 FTC Scholarships including Personalized Education Plans.
- 295,105 FES EO Scholarships
- 121,907 FES UA Scholarships
- More than 30,000 students to receive New Worlds Scholarship Accounts to access tutoring, curriculum and other supplemental support.

- Another 18,000 students utilizing FES Transportation Stipend to commute to schools outside their designated school zone


