LLPD Warns Residents About Scam

The Lady Lake Police Department is investigating two separate fraud cases reported over the weekend involving senior residents who suffered significant financial losses after being contacted by individuals posing as trusted institutions. In both cases, the victims were persuaded to transfer money under false pretenses – and in total lost nearly \$72,000.

While detectives are actively investigating, police are reminding residents, especially seniors and their families, that scammers continue to use increasingly sophisticated and convincing tactics to trick victims into sending money.

According to the Federal Trade Commission, Americans reported losing more than \$2.9 billion to imposter scams, with older adults bearing a disproportionate share of those losses. In 2024, consumers reported losing more money to scams where they paid with bank transfers or cryptocurrency – as is the case with these instances of fraud.

Lady Lake Police Chief Steve Hunt stressed the importance of awareness and prevention:

“If someone calls, texts, or emails you claiming to be from your bank, a government agency, or a major company and asks you to move money, buy gift cards, or send funds through bitcoin or wire transfers, end the conversation immediately,” he said. “Legitimate organizations will never demand payment this way. When in doubt, hang up and call the institution directly using the number on your bank card or official paperwork.”

The Lady Lake Police Department encourages family members and caregivers to speak with their loved ones about fraud prevention. Anyone who believes they or someone they know may have been the target of a scam should contact the Lady Lake Police Department at 352-751-1560.

Dead Body Found

Lady Lake Police investigating dead body found at construction site

At 2:12 PM on Sept. 11, 2025, the Lady Lake Police Department responded to a call from construction crews who discovered a body lying in tall grass at a construction site that has yet to be developed at the corner of CR 466 and CR 100 (Cherry Lake Road).

Upon arrival, officers confirmed the presence of a deceased person in advanced stages of decomposition. The body has not been identified at this time.

The scene has been secured, and the Lake County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Unit is providing technical support to the Lady Lake Criminal Investigation Unit. The State Medical Examiner's Office has been contacted and will be an integral part of the ongoing investigation.

There is no further information available at this time. Updates will be provided as the investigation progresses and once identification is made.

Sergeant Graduates From FBI Academy

LADY LAKE — Lady Lake Police Department Sergeant Charles Gehrsitz has graduated from the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. He is the first officer to be accepted into the academy from the Lady Lake Police Department, joining the ranks of 56,000 law enforcement professionals worldwide who have completed the program since its founding in 1935.

Internationally recognized for its academic excellence, the FBI National Academy offers 10 weeks of advanced training in communication, leadership, and fitness. Participants are seasoned law enforcement leaders selected through a competitive nomination process. Graduates typically return to their agencies to assume senior leadership positions.

Sergeant Gehrsitz, who began his career with the Lady Lake Police Department in 2014, was promoted to Sergeant in 2018 and currently supervises the department's Criminal Investigations Division.

Lady Lake Police Chief Steve Hunt praised Sergeant Gehrsitz's achievement, noting his leadership and dedication.

"Sergeant Gehrsitz has excelled as a proactive, productive, and highly effective leader in our department," said Chief Hunt. "He has taken on responsibilities often handled by lieutenants in larger agencies, developed policy revisions, implemented technology upgrades, and represented our department in public forums. His graduation from the FBI National Academy is a testament to his hard work, professionalism, and commitment to serving the Lady Lake community."

With Sergeant Gehrsitz's graduation, the Lady Lake Police Department now has four National Academy graduates: Chief Hunt (Session 238), Deputy Chief Jason Brough (Session 248), Evidence Technician Scott Kolb (Session 239), and Sergeant Gehrsitz (Session 295).

The 295th session included 254 law enforcement officers from 49 states, the District of Columbia, 20 countries, six military organizations, and four federal civilian agencies.

#1 in Education Freedom

Florida Ranks #1 in Education Freedom for the Fourth Consecutive Year

Home Break-in Arrest

Lady Lake police arrest man for break-in at home of elderly woman

A 53-year-old man was arrested on Friday after he forced his way into a 78-year-old woman's home, attempted to steal her purse, and injured her during the struggle.

Lady Lake Police officers responded to a home on St. Andrews Boulevard around 3:28 p.m. on Aug. 8 after the victim reported that a man had knocked on her door asking for her vehicle keys. Police say he then pushed his way inside, grabbed her purse, and tried to find the keys.

The victim bravely fought to hold on to her belongings, stating "You're not getting my car keys." She was able to push the suspect back outside and call 911. Police responded quickly and located the suspect nearby on St. Andrews Blvd. The victim was able to identify the suspect at the scene.

The victim suffered swelling and redness to her hand.

Craig Steven Johnson, 53, who is listed as homeless, was taken into custody and charged with burglary of an occupied dwelling with battery, robbery by sudden snatching, and battery on a person 65 years or older.

Johnson told officers he had been fleeing from law enforcement when he broke into the home.

The victim sent a letter to the Lady Lake Police department thanking all five officers involved in making the arrest. "Because of their fast response and my detailed description of this person, he was apprehended within 20 minutes or so..." she wrote.

"This was a frightening and unacceptable

attack on one of our senior residents," said Lady Lake Police Chief Steve Hunt. "I am proud of the quick response from our officers, which ensured the suspect was apprehended before anyone else was harmed."

LLPD Issues 150 Citations

Lady Lake Police Department issues 150 citations and warnings

The Lady Lake Police Department issued 91 warnings and 59 citations during a weeklong traffic enforcement campaign aimed at reducing speed-related crashes.

From July 14–20, officers dedicated approximately 80 hours to traffic enforcement as part of the Florida Department of Transportation's annual Operation Southern Slow Down. The campaign is a multi-state initiative involving law enforcement agencies across Florida, Georgia, Alabama, South Carolina and Tennessee.

During the enforcement, Lady Lake police issued 39 citations and 91 written warnings for speeding, 13 citations for aggressive driving, and seven citations for seatbelt violations. No DUI arrests were reported during the campaign.

The goal of Operation Southern Slow Down is to curb dangerous driving behaviors that continue to be a leading factor in traffic crashes, injuries and fatalities across the state. According to the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, speeding and aggressive driving contributed to 437 traffic deaths in Florida in 2023.

"This campaign gives us an opportunity to remind drivers that speeding and aggressive

driving put everyone at risk," said Lady Lake Police Chief Steve Hunt. "Enforcement is just one piece—awareness and personal responsibility are just as important."

The Lady Lake Police Department encourages all motorists to drive within posted speed limits, wear seatbelts, and avoid aggressive behaviors behind the wheel.

"I'm proud that nine of my amendments were included in this year's bill, and I remain committed to ensuring America stays strong, secure, and ready to meet any challenge."

Background:

The FY26 NDAA includes Congresswoman Cammack's amendments to secure defense and medical supply chains, bolster cybersecurity and advanced technology research, improve accountability and readiness within the Department of Defense, and strengthen interagency efforts to combat fentanyl trafficking. These provisions specifically address:

- Supply Chain & Industrial Base Security
- GAO study on Chinese-sourced materials in munitions, microelectronics, and energy storage.
- DoD assessment of vulnerabilities in medical supply chains, including Chinese APIs and devices.
- Cybersecurity & Technology
- Expanding NSA support to share cyber threat intelligence with the defense and telecom sectors.
- Requiring a DoD report on cyber training interoperability and potential for a unified cyber academy.
- Directing DoD to prioritize university partnerships in advanced research areas like hypersonics, biotech, and AI.
- Defense Accountability & Readiness
- Establishing a timeline and annual

reporting requirement for the Department of Defense to achieve a clean audit.

Directing a report on Navy aviation maintenance backlogs and aircraft availability, with attention to Florida bases.

Requiring a DoD/FEMA report on National Guard equipment shortfalls and disaster response capabilities.



Attorney General James Uthmeier Announces Launch of New Portal to Combat Violent Extremism

ORLANDO, Fla.—Attorney General Uthmeier joined Commissioner of Education Anastasios

Kamoutsas at Valencia College to announce the launch of new tool for citizens to help identify and combat politically-motivated violence.

The secure online portal allows the public to submit screenshots, videos, and other evidence of threats of violent extremism directly to Attorney General Uthmeier's Office of Statewide Prosecution. Submissions may be anonymous. Prosecutors will review each report and, where appropriate, prosecute those responsible for the threat. **This portal is not intended for emergencies.** Citizens facing an immediate threat should **call 911.**

"The idea of someone being assassinated for peacefully opposing such radical ideals is vile and anti-American," said **Attorney General James Uthmeier.** "Threats of political violence will not be tolerated in Florida. That is why today we are launching a new tool, simply named the Combat Violent Extremism Portal, to report acts or threats of political violence."

"Any individual who makes a threat that violates Florida law will be dealt with immediately," said **Statewide Prosecutor Brad McVay.** "We look forward to working closely with our law enforcement partners to enhance the efforts to safeguard the Free State of Florida from political violence."

"Any educator who makes vile, despicable comments celebrating and encouraging violence in schools will be

investigated and held accountable," said **Commissioner of Education Anastasios Kamoutsas.** "Thank you Attorney General James Uthmeier for supporting these efforts and helping us ensure Florida's students have the highest quality teachers leading their instruction."

The announcement follows a troubling rise in politically motivated attacks nationwide. Federal reports show assaults on ICE officers have surged by more than 1000% over the past year. Conservative leader and generational icon Charlie Kirk was recently assassinated, with online threats and celebrations of his murder spreading in the aftermath.

The launch of the Combat Violent Extremism Portal reflects Florida's commitment to proactive prevention. By equipping Floridians with a direct channel to prosecutors, the state is strengthening its ability to identify credible threats, disrupt plots before violence occurs, and ensure accountability for those who attempt to endanger lives or undermine public safety.

Attorney General James Uthmeier Charges Another Snapchat Predator with Possession of Child Sexual Abuse Material

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General James Uthmeier's Office of Statewide Prosecution is charging Luke Sedlock, Green Cove Springs, with three felony counts of possession of child sexual abuse material (CSAM) as well as three felony counts of unlawful use of a two-way communication device.

"Over and over again, our office is prosecuting predators who are using Snapchat to trade disgusting content and victimize children. Protecting our kids is my

utmost priority," said **Attorney General James Uthmeier.** "Our statewide prosecutors will ensure that this predator is held accountable for his abhorrent behavior."

The investigation was launched by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement in August 2025 based on tips from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. On Thursday, September 11, the Green Cove Springs Police Department executed a search warrant at Sedlock's residence. Investigators located his electronic devices, which contained both sexual abuse material involving young children and animals.

Sedlock is currently being held in the Clay County Jail on a \$600,000 bond; he is not permitted to have access to devices with internet capabilities or contact with any person under the age of 18.

Attorney General James Uthmeier Announces 230 Arrests in Human Trafficking Operation

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General James Uthmeier announced that 230 suspects will be charged for involvement in illegal acts related to soliciting prostitutes, offering to commit prostitution, or transporting prostitutes. During this investigation, twelve possible human trafficking victims were identified and immediately offered support.

"Human traffickers are vile predators who exploit the vulnerable, and once again, a disproportionate number of those arrested in this sting were illegal aliens," said **Attorney General James Uthmeier.** "Here in Florida, we will not give these traffickers the opportunity to destroy more lives."

"The online prostitution industry enables and empowers human traffickers, allowing them to profit off the people they exploit," said **Polk County Sheriff Grady Judd.** "Our goal is to identify victims, offer them help, and arrest those who are fueling the exploitation of human beings (Johns) and those profiting from the exploitation of

human beings. Prostitution is not a victimless crime – it results in human exploitation, misery, disease, dysfunction, drug and alcohol addiction, violence, and broken families."

This operation was a joint effort led by the Polk County Sheriff's office in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Immigrations and Customs Enforcement, U.S. Army Criminal Investigations Division, the Florida Department of Financial Services, Auburndale PD, Bartow PD, Davenport PD, Haines City PD, Lake Wales PD, Winter Haven PD, Zephyrhills PD, Highlands County Sheriff's Office, State Attorney for the Tenth Judicial Circuit Brian Haas, and Attorney General Uthmeier's Office of Statewide Prosecution.

This investigation involved a seven-day sting operation in which law enforcement utilized social media and escort-hiring platforms to make contact with the defendants. The vast majority of the defendants are repeat offenders, with a combined total of 296 felonies and 348 misdemeanors in the suspects' prior criminal histories.

The defendants include 46 illegal immigrants from Venezuela, Peru, Mexico, Honduras, Guatemala, Cuba, Brazil, Colombia, and the Bahamas, five of whom reported that they are currently receiving financial assistance from the U.S. government.

The defendants will be charged as follows:

- **111** with felony traveling to commit prostitution
- **20** with felony aiding/abetting, transporting, or deriving proceeds from prostitutes
- **99** with misdemeanor soliciting prostitution

These cases will be prosecuted by the Office of Statewide Prosecution and State Attorney for the Tenth Judicial Circuit Brian Haas.

Governor Ron DeSantis Celebrates Constitution Day By Unveiling Benjamin Franklin Statue in Franklin County as Florida Commemorates America250

APALACHICOLA, Fla.—

Governor Ron DeSantis celebrated the 238th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Constitution by unveiling a new statue of Benjamin Franklin in Franklin County, Florida—honoring one of America's most influential founding fathers. Arrests in Organized Fraud Ring

Attorney General James Uthmeier Announces Arrests in Organized Fraud Ring, Crackdown on Repeat Offenders

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Today, Attorney General James Uthmeier announced that the Office of Statewide Prosecution has charged six defendants with engaging in a multi-year scheme to commit large-scale theft and identity fraud across at least five counties in Florida.

“The broader issue at hand here is that repeat offenders pose a major threat to the safety of our communities,” said Attorney General James Uthmeier. “Too often, these criminals are arrested, released, and given another chance to prey on innocent people. In Florida, we don’t just arrest criminals—we keep them behind bars where they belong.”

“The Office of Statewide Prosecution will deploy every tool to dismantle criminal networks made up of career fraudsters and thieves that prey on hardworking Floridians,” said Statewide Prosecutor Brad McVay. “The Office will pursue hefty and enhanced charges to ensure individuals convicted of operating as part of one of these organized crime rings are kept behind bars for a very long time, where they can no longer victimize Floridians.”

The defendants are connected to the “Felony Lane Gang,” a Fort Lauderdale-based theft enterprise that operates across the state. Between March 2021 and May 2023, they carried out over 200 smash-and-grab burglaries at gyms, parks, and other

public spaces. Their targets were wallets and purses containing checkbooks, credit cards, IDs, and even passports. The defendants were then using the stolen personal identification information to commit fraud by cashing forged checks and fraudulently withdrawing money from bank accounts.

During the span of the scheme, the defendants stole over \$385,000 from the victims, including 55 senior citizens.

Each of these charges carry a maximum sentence of 30 years, along with a fine of up to \$10,000. This case will be handled by Attorney General Uthmeier’s Office of Statewide Prosecution.

Everglades Restoration

Governor Ron DeSantis Celebrates Continued Everglades Restoration Projects

This project is the first to break ground under Florida’s new Everglades restoration acceleration agreement with the U.S. Department of the Army

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, Fla.—Governor Ron DeSantis marked the official groundbreaking of the Blue Shanty Flow Way project, an important milestone in Everglades restoration which will ensure that more water flows from the to-be-completed EAA Reservoir south into Everglades National Park and Florida Bay.

“We are acting on our historic agreement with the Trump Administration to expedite Everglades restoration using federal funds

and state expertise,” said Governor Ron DeSantis. “Today’s groundbreaking on the Blue Shanty Flow Way project in Miami-Dade County is a milestone in our Everglades restoration efforts, building on our many previous conservation actions.”

This marks the first event since the State of Florida and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers signed a [new landmark agreement](#) on July 18, 2025, to accelerate the restoration of America’s Everglades. Under the new agreement, the State of Florida assumed responsibility for the Blue Shanty Flow Way and anticipates that it will be done about two years faster than planned.

The Blue Shanty Flow Way is the final project to “uncork” Tamiami Trail that was planned as part of the Central Everglades Planning Project under the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan.

The Central Everglades Planning Project will deliver an average of 370,000 acre-feet of additional water each year from Lake Okeechobee to the Central Everglades – an essential step in restoring the River of Grass. It includes 8.5 miles of a new Blue Shanty Levee and the removal of older levees to allow water to move naturally.

The benefits of the Blue Shanty Flow Way include:

- Restoration of a more natural and historic flow of clean water south.

- Improved habitat for fish, birds, and other Everglades wildlife.

- Support for outdoor recreation and ecotourism.

- Strengthening of the connection between the Central Everglades and Florida Bay.

“With every project, from reservoirs to flow ways, we are delivering real results on time, under budget and with strong returns for Florida’s taxpayers,” said **DEP Secretary Alexis A. Lambert**. “Alongside our federal partners, state leadership and communities, we will continue driving restoration projects forward.”

Since taking office, Governor DeSantis has made restoring the Everglades and improving water quality a cornerstone of his administration. On his second day in office, he issued Executive Order 19-12, which committed \$2.5 billion over four years for water quality and Everglades projects. That goal was exceeded in his first term, with \$3.3 billion invested—more than the previous 12 years combined.

In his second term, Governor DeSantis has continued this momentum. With \$1.4 billion included in this year’s FY 2025-26 Budget, the state has now committed \$4.6 billion in the first three years of the term, putting Florida on pace to exceed his \$3.5 billion second-term goal. Altogether, nearly \$8 billion has been invested since 2019 in Everglades restoration and water quality.
