## Best of the Best Medical Team!

I would like to tell you about an amazing medical team. But the story must start back a few weeks before in the Shans medical emergency room Ocala Fl.. My wife fell and hit her head on the corner molding opening her head up quit a bit it took nine staples to close her up. We took her to the Shan's emergency room in Ocala located I-75 and SR 27, nice clean looking facility no waiting quick service. After closing the wound. They had to check to see if she had internal damage, she did not but "oh no" there a mass (tumor) in her head, The doctors were surprised. They recommended we take her to a neurosurgeon with urgency.

I'm a newspaper guy so I know a little bit about research. My research told me the best neurosurgeon was Doctor Jacob Freeman, he is one of the few that does this kind of surgery. He is very busy and was kind hard to access. His staff was on it. When I told the Surgical Nurse I was afraid my wife was on her way out and she needed his help. That was New Year's Eve, he said go to the HCA emergency room now, he will call ahead and after checking her they would give her a room and begin testing. Three days of testing they had scheduled her surgery for the next week. Surgery date was approved. While talking to Doctor Freeman he said he has been working with an ear nose and throat specialist a Doctor Jose L. Ziron Jr. MD so we were waiting to see if he could assist. Next day they scheduled the operation.

We showed up at the hospital at 5:30 AM and they started preparing her for the operation. The ear nose and throat specialist Doctor Ziron started by opening a passageway for Doctor Freeman to do the

tumor surgery. He went in through the Nasal passage with a camera and surgical tools and took out the tumor. He explained later, he took most of the tumor it was benign, it was attached at a bad place. He settled for him taking approximately 90% of the tumor to avoid damaging a very tricky area where it was attached.

We are blessed, my wife said we had three the best of the best in the operating room the two specialists and the Lord. She was never afraid! We had hundreds or maybe thousands of people praying for her and the surgeon's skills. Lady Lake Chamber sent a best wishes with 40 signatures on it. The business club that I am president of, all members wished her well. I believe GOD was holding her hand but the next sign was two days in ICU and two days in a regular room and home to the recliner! She was instructed to do nothing, especially don't sneeze. Then I needed God holding my hand! Ha, just kidding. Her sinuses were packed. Using a walker for a few days she was walking again in two days, now it is therapy twice a week and is doing everything the therapist says. Two weeks she is walking better without assistance of a walker, telling this story at press time my wife is seeing better she is threading the needle on her sewing machine, the tumor was putting pressure on her optics. She is sleeping better at night! She remembers everything and is doing most of what she did five years ago. Someone said her falling was an act of GOD and her healing is an act of top notch neurosurgeon Doctor Jacob Freeman and Ear/nose & throat doctor Jose L. Ziron who said, she was an assume patient and not to forget the great hospital

## CHAIR CHAT

Sent on Behalf of the Marion County Republican Executive Committee (MCREC)

Dear Board Member

Subject: Promises Made / Promises Broken

The school board made a commitment to the Marion County citizens that it would conduct a national search to fill the leadership role of School Superintendent. This commitment was discarded, as honestly noted with concern by Board member Cummings during the Dec 18th Board meeting.

First – We have no malice or adverse position against Dr Brewer; however, we do object to circumventing the promised process to nationally seek and evaluate all qualified candidates. The MCREC supports selecting the best leader to improve the lagging academic performance of this school district. We request the continued evaluation of the current leadership while conducting the national search process. This approach accomplishes two complementary goals;

- a) assessing on-going student performance / improvement, and
- b) completing a competitive leadership search to sustain long-term improvement.

The Dec 18th announcement to short-circuit the comparative / competitive process, immediately followed an overview of recent PM2 test score data, as well as anecdotal comments by the Board. The test

scores review just prior to the “Superintendent decision,” appears to be part of the rationale to discard the promised “national search” process. As noted below, the recent test scores indicate county-wide there is a significant segment of students that are still lagging in essential skills.

2025 PM2 Test Data - County-wide Grades 3 to 8 scores indicate: 60% of students did not meet criteria for reading, and 70% did not meet criteria for math

A further review overview of select data indicates:

PM2 2024 vs 2025 Language Arts Test Scores

Language Arts - The 3rd, 4th and 10th grade individual schools language/reading scores were evaluated using a paired t-test ( $\alpha = 0.05 / 95\%$  2-tail confidence interval) – this simple analysis indicates there is no statistical improvement in student performance.

As an example; for 3rd grade - 17 out of 31 schools scored below 31% proficiency; therefore, more than 70% of third grade students in these schools are lagging in reading / language skills. This is very problematic since third grade performance is cited by experts as a predictor of future success.

**Subject: Promises Made / Promises Broken (page 2 of 2)**

Math – 3rd, 4th and 5th grades 2024 vs 2025 data (same statistical methodology as above)

Grade 3 - statistical improvement although the 2025 PM2 county-wide average is below 25%, therefore, 75% of students are not demonstrating on grade

math skills.

Grade 4 -no statistical change, scores indicate 24 schools scored < 20% proficiency, therefore, ~80% of students at these schools are below math criteria.

Grade 5 - data indicate a statistical improvement; however, 15 schools scored < 25% proficiency; that is 15 schools with ~75% of students below criteria

Overall, the test scores reflect a school system that continues to struggle to educate

students to achieve basic skills needed for future success.

Promise Made / Promise Broken – Given the sustained lagging performance of Marion County Schools a rigorous competitive recruitment for Superintendent should be a key driver. If at the end of this competitive process Dr Brewer is selected, this would further validate her for the position; the decision to short-cut a

## FAIRTAX



The Council of Economic Advisors (CEA) is an agency within the Executive Office of the President that provides

objective economic analysis and advice on both domestic and international policy. The CEA is considered one of the most prestigious appointments an economist can receive and is often viewed as the "pinnacle" career. Unlike other government agencies that are often led by political operatives, the CEA is almost exclusively staffed by top-tier academic economists including several Nobel Prize winners. This is why reports issued by the CEA are taken seriously by both politicians and economists.

The January 2026 report by the CEA is labeled "The Economic Impact of State Income Tax Elimination" and their Executive Summary states:

- \* Income taxes are more economically damaging than sales or property taxes;
- \* The harmful economic effects of state income taxes include outmigration, brain drain, stifled innovation and entrepreneurship, and reduced GDP;
- \* The harmful fiscal effects of state income taxes include revenue volatility with "feast and famine" cycles, with states often gaining little or no new revenue from income tax hikes because of the negative economic effects they unleash. Key findings

from CEA's analysis of state income tax phase-out include:

- \* A 1 to 1.6 percent increase in the level of GDP for the average state;
- \* A 16 to 19 percent increase in new startups for the average state;
- \* A \$4,000 increase in the average wage;
- \* A significant influx of new high-income taxpayers;
- \* An average state sales tax of under 8 percent under full revenue replacement with no limits on spending growth;
- \* An average state tax rate of 6.2 percent under a scenario with spending growth limits.

The remainder of this CEA report discusses extensively each of these points. While the economists who have done studies for the FAIRtax have pointed out many of these points, it is great to see a group as prestigious as the CEA make a compelling case for the elimination of state income taxes and replacing them with consumption taxes. This CEA report is an indicator that serious people are paying attention to what is a growing movement among states for eliminating their state income tax.

What is missing from this analysis is the effect of a family consumption allowance (FCA), the prebate. The FCA allows purchases up to the poverty level to be not subject to the state sales tax.

Alabama and Georgia are contemplating passing a state version of the FAIRtax. One

of the reasons that the plans are gaining favorable attention from both sides of the aisle is the inclusion of the FCA ensuring that people in the lower income levels are not adversely affected.

The momentum is growing. As of now Mississippi, Oklahoma, Kentucky, Iowa and Georgia have passed legislation targeting the full elimination of the state income tax. Other states are moving to greatly reduce or eliminate their state income tax.

The other thing that is not directly considered by the CEA report is the effect

that the repeal of the federal income/payroll tax system and replacement by a consumption tax, like the FAIRtax, will have on the U.S. If elimination of the state income tax has these benefits, the benefits on the national level will be even more pronounced than at the state level.

The FAIRtax is the answer.



### Cammack Leads Florida Delegation Calling for USDA Disaster Declaration After Historic Freeze

Washington, D.C. — Congresswoman Kat Cammack and all 29 members of Florida's

bipartisan congressional delegation are urging U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Brooke Rollins to immediately approve a USDA Disaster Declaration for Florida counties devastated by historic freezing temperatures in late January and early February.

The freeze struck during peak production for many of Florida's major commodities, causing widespread and catastrophic losses across the state's agricultural sector. A disaster declaration would unlock critical federal assistance for farmers and ranchers facing severe and ongoing recovery challenges.

"Florida supplies fresh produce to nearly 150 million Americans during the winter months, and when Florida agriculture is hit, the entire country feels it," Cammack said. "This is a national security issue. A nation that cannot feed itself, cannot secure itself. This freeze caused widespread, historic, and devastating damage. Farmers are facing wiped-out crops, lost income, and months or even years of recovery through no fault of their own. A USDA Disaster Declaration is essential to get relief on the ground now and protect Florida agriculture and America's food supply from collapsing under this blow," said Congresswoman Cammack.

Agriculture is Florida's second-largest economic sector, producing more than 300 commodities and supporting hundreds of thousands of jobs. During the late January and early February freeze, temperatures

shattered long-standing city and county records. According to the USDA's National Free On-Board Review, central Florida is already experiencing a strawberry shortage following extreme cold on February 2-3, 2026.

Beyond strawberries, significant losses are expected across a wide range of commodities, including citrus, vegetables, sugar cane, nurseries, apiaries, and aquaculture operations. Some impacts are expected to last months and, in some cases, extend into future growing seasons. Florida Agriculture Commissioner Wilton Simpson estimates the freeze caused more than \$1 billion in crop damage statewide.

In their letter, the bipartisan Florida delegation stressed the urgency of deploying disaster assistance and called on USDA and the Administration to work with Congress to ensure adequate funding to help producers recover.

### Cammack Cosponsors SAVE America Act

Washington, D.C. — Today, Congresswoman Kat Cammack (R-FL-03) joined more than 70 House Republicans in cosponsoring the SAVE America Act, the most comprehensive election integrity bill to date.

The SAVE America Act requires voter ID in federal elections and preserves existing requirements for proof of U.S. citizenship when registering to vote. Despite false Democratic claims, the bill does not disenfranchise women or minorities. Election integrity measures like voter ID are supported by more than 80 percent of Americans, including a majority of Democrats.

"This is a real issue with real consequences," said Congresswoman Cammack. "The SAVE America Act does what voters want: proof of citizenship, voter

ID, and common-sense limits on mail-in ballots. That's not extreme, it's responsible. If Democrats are blocking it, Americans should ask why."

Congresswoman Cammack remains committed to protecting election integrity and ensuring every legal vote counts.

The SAVE America Act will:

Require photo ID to vote in federal elections.

Require proof of U.S. citizenship, in person, to register to vote.

Remove non-citizens from voter rolls.

End universal mail-in ballots, with limited exceptions.

Dear Secretary Rollins:

We write in support of Florida Agriculture Commissioner Wilton Simpson's request for a U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Disaster Declaration for counties in the State of Florida impacted by the freezing temperatures that occurred at the end of January and the beginning of February. This declaration will make it clear that the federal government's resources will be available to Florida's farmers and ranchers.

Agriculture is the second-largest economic sector in Florida's economy, and this weather disaster struck during the production seasons for many of our state's 300 commodities. These plummeting temperatures broke city and county records not seen in decades across the state. Already, the USDA has reported in its National Free On Board Review that central Florida will see a shortage of strawberry supply due to the extreme cold weather on February 2-3, 2026. More commodities, including avocados, bell peppers, sugar cane, broccoli, celery, sweet corn, cucumbers, radishes, cabbage, citrus,

eggplant, green beans, potatoes, squash, tomatoes, apiaries, nurseries, and aquaculture, face threats of production loss that will last for months and in some cases even into future years.

We appreciate your dedication to American agriculture and hope that you will call on Congress and those in the Administration who oversee and operate disaster programs to quickly provide the necessary funds to help our state recover from this tragic event.





**James Uthmeier Secures Convictions in Multi-Million-Dollar Organized Retail Theft Scheme**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Attorney General James Uthmeier announced that the Office of Statewide Prosecution

secured a conviction for husband-and-wife duo, Robert and Jaclyn Dell, of St. Petersburg, for running an organized retail theft scheme. Robert, a former pastor at The Rock Church in St. Petersburg, and his wife, Jaclyn, operated a 'transformation center' purporting to provide counseling and assistance to individuals recovering from drug addiction.

"These fraudsters hid their true motives behind faith and charity to launder proceeds from a large-scale criminal enterprise," said Attorney General James Uthmeier. "I am grateful to Ag Law Enforcement, FDLE, Chief Assistant Statewide Prosecutor Paul Dontenville, and Assistant Statewide Prosecutors Eric Ross and Gianna Fina for ensuring that justice was served in this case."

"These verdicts show exactly what happens when Florida refuses to be a soft-on-crime state," said Florida Commissioner of Agriculture Wilton Simpson. "Our Agricultural Law Enforcement agents were

alongside the Attorney General's Office, FDLE, and Home Depot to dismantle a long-running retail theft ring that victimized businesses across multiple counties. Organized retail crime drives up costs for everyday Floridians and undermines public safety. We will continue to use every tool at our disposal to protect law-abiding families, support our law enforcement, and deliver real results for the people we serve."

"These two criminals were defrauding vulnerable Floridians while pretending to serve our communities," said Florida Department of Law Enforcement Commissioner Mark Glass. "I applaud our analysts and partners for uncovering the full scope of their exploitation and helping secure this verdict."

"Today's guilty verdicts are yet another powerful example of Attorney General James Uthmeier's relentless efforts to dismantle organized retail crime for the safety of our stores, our customers and our team members," said Scott Shalley, President and CEO of the Florida Retail Federation. "In collaboration with Agriculture Commissioner Wilton Simpson, FDLE Commissioner Mark Glass, local law enforcement and our retail stores, General Uthmeier has made clear that Florida is a law and order state, where organized retail crime is not tolerated and criminals will be held accountable. With the strongest laws and enforcement in the nation, Florida is a safer place to work and

shop."

"At The Home Depot, the safety of our associates is our top priority. We have implemented comprehensive strategies to protect against organized retail crime (ORC) over the past few years with great success, but it remains at a high across the retail industry," said Scott Glenn, Vice President of Asset Protection at The Home Depot. "We're proud to play a role in the nationwide effort to combat ORC and grateful for the partnership and dedication of Attorney General Uthmeier and local law enforcement in investigating these cases and holding offenders accountable."

Robert and Jaclyn Dell were arrested in August 2023 following a joint investigation by the Office of Statewide Prosecution, the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, and The Home Depot Asset Protection Team.

Investigators determined that under the guise of counseling and assistance for people recovering from drug addiction, the Dells coordinated a long-running, multi-million-dollar retail theft scheme targeting The Home Depot.

Co-conspirators Jessica Wild and Daniel Mace stole power tools from The Home Depot locations across Citrus, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, and Sarasota counties. The stolen merchandise was delivered nightly to the Dells' house and then sold online. The scheme generated over \$2 million in illegal proceeds from 2015-2023.

Following a two-week jury trial, Robert was found guilty as charged of RICO,

Conspiracy to Commit RICO, Dealing in Stolen Property, and Money Laundering (2 counts). Jaclyn was also found guilty as charged of Conspiracy to Commit RICO. They are facing up to 150 years and 30 years in the Florida Department of Corrections, respectively.

Sentencing is set for March 13, 2025, in Pinellas County.

**Attorney General James Uthmeier Secures 120-Year Prison Sentence for Convicted Human Trafficker**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General James Uthmeier announced that the Office of Statewide Prosecution secured a 120-year prison sentence for Marquett James, 50, of Hillsborough County; the incarceration will be served over 90 years, with some terms running concurrently.

"In a case that the Biden DOJ refused to prosecute, our Office of Statewide Prosecution worked with HSI under the Trump administration to deliver a sentence that ensures this offender will never have the opportunity to exploit another victim," said Attorney General James Uthmeier. "Crimes of this nature cause life-long harm and must be met with punishments that reflect their severity. In Florida, there will be no leniency for sexual predators and human traffickers."

James was convicted in November 2025 on felony charges of Human Trafficking (2 counts), Racketeering, and Conspiracy to Commit Racketeering. He will serve his sentence in the Florida Department of Corrections.

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla.**—Governor Ron DeSantis announced

preliminary estimates from VISIT FLORIDA indicating that Florida welcomed 143.3 million visitors in calendar year 2025: another record-setting performance for the Sunshine State. In the fourth quarter of 2025, an estimated 33.5 million visitors traveled to the state, making it the highest fourth quarter visitation on record.

Preliminary estimates show that domestic travelers accounted for 91.5 percent of all visitors in 2025, with 131.1 million Americans traveling to Florida. Overseas visitation reached 9.3 million, while Canadian visitation totaled 2.9 million, consistent with historical trends where Canadian travel represents approximately two percent of total visitation. Florida also experienced continued growth from key international markets, with strong increases from Latin American countries such as Brazil and Argentina, as well as European markets including the United Kingdom, France, Spain, Italy, and the Netherlands. Brazil is now the second-largest international source of visitors to the state. VISIT FLORIDA remains focused on expanding international visitation through strategic marketing efforts.

Florida continues to be the #1 domestic travel destination in the United States and a top choice for international visitors.

“Florida continues to set the standard as the top travel destination in the nation, welcoming millions of visitors while delivering real economic benefits for our residents,” said **Governor Ron DeSantis**. “Through strategic investments in infrastructure, public safety, and environmental stewardship, we are ensuring that Florida remains a place where families can vacation with confidence and where our tourism industry can continue to thrive.”

“As the #1 domestic travel destination, families and vacationers know that Florida has set the gold standard for the tourism industry,” said **Secretary J. Alex Kelly, Florida Department of Commerce**. “This new milestone is the direct result of strategic investments in our communities that promote job growth, bolster small businesses and fortify infrastructure—cementing Florida’s place as a travel destination, both nationally and internationally. Governor DeSantis has made Florida the premier destination for

travelers looking to experience all Florida has to offer.”

Key highlights from VISIT FLORIDA’s fourth quarter and calendar year 2025 preliminary visitation estimates are below. Final figure confirmations are expected as data becomes available throughout the spring.

**Q4 2025**

Preliminary estimates indicate that 33.5 million total visitors (in person-trips) traveled to Florida in the fourth quarter (Q4) of 2025, a +0.6% increase from Q4 2024 and a record high for a fourth quarter.

- In Q4 2025, Domestic visitation is estimated at 30.31 million, and international visitation is estimated at 3.2 million.

- Domestic visitors accounted for 90.5% of total visitors, while international visitors accounted for 9.5%.

- Total enplanements at 19 Florida airports totaled 27.4 million in Q4 2025, up by +2.8% from Q4 2024.

**Calendar Year 2025**

- Preliminary estimates indicate that 143.3 million total visitors (in person-trips) traveled to Florida in calendar year (CY) 2025, a +0.2% increase from CY 2024.

- Domestic visitation accounted for 91.5% of total visitation in 2025, up slightly from 91.4% the previous year, while overseas visitation made up 6.5% and Canadian visitation made up 2.0%, in line with historical visitation records.

- Domestic visitation is estimated at 131.1 million in 2025, an increase of +0.3% from 2024. Overseas visitation is estimated at 9.3 million, with Canadian visitation at 2.9 million.

- Florida saw growth across all top 5 overseas origin countries year over year. Brazil grew 10.4% from 2024, Argentina grew 17.8% and Spain entered the top 10 origin countries with 10.4% growth in visitors.

- Preliminary estimates indicate an air/non-air split for domestic visitors of 35.8% / 64.2% in 2025, with a smaller share traveling to Florida by air than in 2024.

Travel trends indicate that finding value shapes the contemporary tourists’ travel choices. According to a recent Marketing Effectiveness Study, travelers to Florida who are aware of VISIT FLORIDA’s marketing efforts express that Florida offers good value for money by an additional 23 points as opposed to those who are not.

## Nationwide Blood Shortage



Red Cross Urges Immediate Donations Amid 35% Drop

(NAPSI)—The American Red Cross has declared a severe blood shortage after the

national supply fell by about 35% in the past month—a crisis fueled by a surge in flu cases and winter storms disrupting blood drives. Hospitals already strained by flu-related admissions are now being forced to triage critical blood products, putting trauma victims, mothers in childbirth, and patients with cancer or sickle cell disease at serious risk.

"After the holiday distractions, we enter flu season—a time when Hispanics face a higher risk of hospitalization due to limited access to healthcare," says Dr. Maribel García Colón, Medical Director at the American Red Cross. "At the same time, winter weather leads to more accidents where a person may require an emergency transfusion. This is where Hispanics can make a difference: 60% of this population has type O blood, the most commonly used blood type in emergencies when there's no time to determine a patient's blood type. By donating blood, we give others the chance to live."

Last month alone, nearly 400 blood drives were canceled due to severe winter weather, leaving thousands of donations uncollected. With more storms forecast, the situation

could worsen without immediate donor action.

"Thanks to blood donations, Valerio is celebrating his sixth birthday."

Having just turned six, Valerio has overcome health challenges that rival those faced by the superheroes he admires. Born with a rare congenital condition affecting the left side of the heart—Valerio's doctors told his mother, Liliana, that he would need multiple heart surgeries to survive.

The first of four open-heart surgeries took place just one week after his birth. Blood transfusions were critical to the success of each procedure. "If he hadn't received the blood he needed during surgery—and the platelets afterward—Valerio wouldn't have recovered so quickly," says Liliana.

She vividly remembers the fear of imagining what might happen if blood hadn't been available. "Blood donations have shaped the course of our family's life. My son is resilient and faces everything with courage, but none of this would be possible without the generosity of blood donors."
