Heat Related Deaths

The state of Florida has the second highest total number of heat related deaths of children being left unattended in a vehicle. More than half of vehicular heatstroke cases from 1998 to 2018 were because an adult forgot about a child, according to NoHeatstroke.org. Additionally, every year pets suffer and die when their guardians make the mistake of leaving them unattended in a parked vehicle to "run in for just a minute" at the local store. The Lady Lake Police Department is committed to informing and educating parents and pet owners on the dangers of leaving children and pets unattended in a vehicle and taking precautions to help prevent these tragic situations.

Leaving a child or a pet in a hot car even for a short period of time can be dangerous, even if parked in a shade or with the windows cracked. A vehicle's glass transparency allows for the sun's rays to heat up the inside essentially creating a vacuum

of heat. Within minutes a car that was just being cooled can experience a spike in temperature. On a sunny day, when outside temperatures are 70 degrees the inside temperature of a vehicle can rise to 89 degrees within 10 minutes and 104 degrees within 30 minutes. At 80 degrees outside, the inside temperature of a vehicle can rise to 94 degrees in 10 minutes and soar up to 114 degrees in 30 minutes.

A child's body temperature can rise up to five times faster than an adult's and death will occur with a body temperature of 107 degrees. Dogs and cats can't sweat like humans, so they pant to lower their body temperature. If they're inside a car, recycling very hot air, panting gives no relief, and heat stroke can happen quickly.

I encourage you to take these safety precautions to help avoid these preventable tragedies.

Sanford, Fla. — Today, First Lady Casey DeSantis held a listening session on mental health and substance abuse at the Seminole County Sheriff's Office in Sanford. First Lady DeSantis also announced the formation of a drug abuse prevention panel with Seminole County Sheriff Dennis Lemma to serve as chair. The focus of the panel will be to discuss and determine best practices and innovative solutions to combat drug abuse throughout the state, specifically as it pertains to Florida's youth.

"I am excited to announce the formation of a new drug abuse prevention panel and I thank Sheriff Dennis Lemma for his willingness to serve as chair of this important initiative," said **First Lady DeSantis**. "As we enter the school year, we want to make sure that kids know how dangerous drugs can be, as well as what they should do if someone in their home is using drugs. We will continue to confront these challenges head-on and I look forward to working with leaders from around the state to determine how we can better serve those in need."

The First Lady was joined today by Agency for Health Care Administration Secretary Mary Mayhew, Department of Juvenile Justice Secretary Simone

Marsteller, Representative Cyndi Stevenson, Representative Scott Plakon, Seminole County Sheriff Dennis Lemma, Orange County Sheriff John Mina, Department of Children and Families Chief of Staff David Mica, as well as stakeholders and community leaders from the Orlando area.

"It was a pleasure having First Lady DeSantis at the Seminole County Sheriff's Office today and I am honored to chair her new drug abuse prevention panel," said **Seminole County Sheriff Dennis Lemma**. "The collective IQ of a group is always stronger than that of an individual and through increased collaboration being spearheaded by the First Lady, I am confident we will find meaningful solutions to these challenges facing Floridians."

"First Lady Casey DeSantis' leadership in this area is needed and welcome," said **Representative Cyndi Stevenson**. "Her energy, and the act of bringing people together will serve as a catalyst to promote needed improvements in the access to care and will pay long term dividends for many Floridians and their families."

Governor DeSantis' Bold Vision for a Brighter Future Budget included nearly \$2 billion in substance abuse prevention and mental health funding. The Governor's budget also included \$75 million for the Mental Health Assistance Allocation for Florida schools. This funding will go directly to school districts to provide additional mental health services to students in need.

Grilled Sweet Potatoes



(NAPSI)—The next time you're firing up the outdoor grill (or indoor grill pan, for that matter), throw on a sweetpotato or two. An easy, healthy side dish with a huge wow factor, grilled sweetpotatoes are nutrient rich, high in fiber and absolutely delicious. And they go great with burgers, steaks, chops, chicken or pretty much anything off the grill.

Start with this basic recipe, and if you're feeling creative, try different shapes—sweetpotato coins or steak fries, for example. Or add your favorite herbs and spices—such as chopped fresh rosemary, thyme, cinnamon or smoked paprika.

Grilled Sweetpotatoes

Serves 3 or 4

1 lb orange- or yellow/white-fleshed sweetpotatoes, cut lengthwise into ¾-inch wedges

1 ½ Tbsp olive oil

1 tsp salt, plus more for sprinkling

Heat a grill or grill pan to medium-high. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, combine sweetpotatoes, oil and salt. Arrange sweetpotatoes on the grill or grill pan and cook until lightly charred and tender, 6 to 8 minutes, turning halfway through. Sprinkle with more salt and serve.



your car every time you park.

•Set an alarm on your cell phone or computer calendar as a reminder to drop

your child off at child care. Make the alarm sound different from other alert tones.

- Keep a stuffed animal in the child's car seat. Place it on the front passenger seat as a reminder when the child is in the back seat.
- Ask your babysitter or child care provider to call you if your child hasn't arrived as scheduled.
- If you are driving a child, put something you need in the back seat so you will need to open the back door. Items may include a cellphone, handbag, employee badges, or any other item you would need at your destination.

What to do if you find a pet confined to a vehicle:

- Take the vehicle's make, model, color and license plate number and notify your local Animal Control or Police Department.
- Once removed from the vehicle, provide water to drink and if possible spray with a garden hose or immerse in cool water for up to two minutes to gradually lower the body temperature.
- Watch for signs and symptoms of heatstroke such as restlessness, thick saliva, heavy panting, glazed eyes, dark tongue, rapid heartbeat, difficulty breathing, dizziness, seizure and lack of coordination. If a dog shows any of these symptoms remove it from the heat and transport to a veterinarian immediately.
- Practice safety awareness and follow these precautions this summer season with your children and your pets to prevent a vehicle heat-related tragedy from happening to your family. Stay safe.

Our military members risk their lives in service to our country. Sadly, while they are deployed overseas, and even after they retire from service, scammers may target them to try to make a dishonest dollar. July is Military Consumer Protection Month, and in recognition of the month, I launched our Patriot Protection Week Campaign. This initiative aims to help Florida's service members and veterans guard against military-related scams by directly providing them consumer protection tips and resources.

As part of our Campaign, I released our 2019 Military Consumer Protection Resource Guide. The Guide is full of information, advice and resources to help the more than 90,000 active and reserve members of the Armed Forces and 1.5 million veterans who call Florida home.

Tips to avoid common military-related scams include:

- Beware of scammers using misleading photos or language to imply association with a branch of the U.S. Military;
- Verify the authenticity of an email or text that appears to be from a military branch. Phishing schemes use manipulated messages that appear to be from a military branch or the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in an effort to target service members, veterans or their family members;
- Ensure any veterans charity soliciting funds is registered with the state Department of Agriculture and Consumer

Services at 800HelpFla.com; and Place an active duty alert on credit reports at no cost. An active duty alert requires businesses to take additional steps before granting credit in the name of active duty personnel serving overseas.

Never Miss Your Medication

How To Never Miss A Day Of Your Medication



Golf Cart complaint

One persons opinion!

This needs to be heard, written and exposed! I have lived in the Villages for nine years. I live in the Villages of Delmar. Up until about three years ago I didn't realize how dangerous it is for Golf Cart drivers to drive in the Golf Cart path, Clearly marked Golf Carts and bike path.

I understand that walkers use the same path and no problem sharing with them. However recently while riding with several of my friends (one being an elderly client) whenever we see someone walking towards us in the Golf Cart Path, they don't step aside up on the curb, grass to safety, instead they continue walking which makes the Golf Cart pull out into traffic to avoid hitting them. I was with my client and without looking back or using a turn signal he, by instinct, just pulled around the walkers. One time we came very close to being hit by a car.

Villagers know to watch out for walkers or Golf Cart drivers and are alert to what might happen, but visitors are not prepared to watch out for a carts pulling out in front of them.

Now this is where I'm so upset... I refuse to pull out into the road when walkers can just step up to safety, preventing the Golf Cart driver from instinctively pulling out into traffic. I come to a dead stop and wait until the walker goes around me...but you would not believe how many times I have been used out for not going around them putting myself in danger when all they have to do was step up!!!

Last week on my way to golf, I was following another golfer in our Golf Carts I noticed she always pulled out into traffic when ever a walker came up her path, with out looking back or using a turn sign. 

Identify Flood-Damaged Vehicles

(NAPSI)—Following record-setting rainfall in many areas of the country, flooding has taken its toll on vehicles. It's important for those considering buying a used vehicle to be car care aware and check for signs of water intrusion or contamination, advises the nonprofit Car Care Council.

"Purchasing a used vehicle and later learning it has been flood damaged can be very problematic and lead to costly issues down the road. Worse yet, these vehicles can be unhealthy to occupy because of mold and bacteria growing in the carpet and ventilation system," explained Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council.

The Car Care Council and the Car Care Professionals Network (CCPN), a group of automotive service providers, say it all comes down to how much water the vehicle took in and where it can be reached. They recommend these five steps to determine if a vehicle has been flood damaged:

Take the sniff test. Close all the windows and doors and let the car sit for about five minutes. Then, crack open a door and sniff. Mildew and mold have very distinctive smells and it doesn't take long for that smell to present itself.



Services Available

Different types of service providers focus on different types of services:

Employment Networks (EN) are private or public organizations that can help with career counseling and assistance with job placement, including advising about how benefits will be affected by work. Some ENs provide services only to their local community, while others work across one or more states or even nationwide.

State Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) agencies provide training to help people develop a variety of new skills or strengthen current ones to help people with disabilities return to work, enter a new line of work or enter the workforce for the first time.

Work Incentives Planning & Assistance (WIPA) organizations provide free benefits counseling to help beneficiaries make informed choices about work. These groups provide in-depth counseling about working and the effect that earning money will have on benefits.

Teen Vaping Disturbing Trend

Our fact-gathering mission to find out what is behind a dramatic increase in teen vaping in Florida continued. According to the Florida Department of Health, e-cigarette use among high school students increased 78 percent from 2017 to 2018.

We want to know why, and more importantly how to reverse this disturbing trend. This mission brought me to two Florida cities—Oviedo and Sarasota—this week, where I met with education leaders, law enforcement officers and concerned parents.

According to a [FDH study](#), more than 28 percent of students in Sarasota County and Seminole County use e-cigarettes—slightly higher than the state average. Shockingly, people I spoke to believe the rate is much higher.

This is extremely concerning because, according to the Centers for Disease Control, juvenile nicotine exposure can harm brain development in ways that may affect the health and mental health of youth.

To stop this trend and protect our kids, we need to find out how minors are getting their hands on these products. It's illegal under Florida law to sell these products to anyone under 18, yet vaping among minors is out of control.

As your Attorney General, I am dedicated to protecting all Floridians, but especially the most vulnerable among us. While vaping may be a useful tool to help adults stop smoking traditional

cigarettes, kids may have no idea of the risks involved. In fact, two out of three high school students do not know that the products contain nicotine.

As a mother, I want to ensure all our children have an opportunity to grow and learn in a safe, healthy environment. That is why, I want to encourage parents to talk to their kids about the risks associated with children vaping.

This is just one way, working together, we will build a stronger, safer Florida.

Avoid Moving



Scams This Summer

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Summer is the most popular time of year to move, and Attorney General Ashley Moody is issuing a Consumer Alert to help Floridians avoid scams during this busy moving season. A common moving scam involves companies agreeing to a price for service, loading a consumer's personal belongings and then demanding more money before delivering the property. Sometimes this tactic involves charging additional fees supposedly based on the weight or volume of property moved or other factors not previously disclosed.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Moving can be a stressful experience. Scammers know this and exploit an already tense situation to coerce consumers into paying increased costs or fees just to get through the process or to have their possessions safely returned. Before moving, do your research and take steps to ensure you do not fall victim to disreputable household movers."

To avoid common moving scams consumers should:

- Research moving companies thoroughly with the Better Business Bureau to determine if other consumers have filed complaints against a company;
- Check online for independent reviews separate from the moving company's website, such as on Google or the Better Business Bureau;
- Make sure that the moving company is properly licensed with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration;
- Never sign any blank or incomplete documents presented by a moving company;
- Obtain estimates and quotes from several different moving companies in writing and make sure the estimates are binding;
- Determine whether the movers will perform the move alone or if the company will be subcontracting to another carrier; and
- Beware if movers show up in rental trucks and without uniformed personnel. These may be fly-by-night companies without appropriate licenses or insurance coverage.

Additional tips and resources can be found by visiting the United States Department of Transportation Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's website.

Since 2018, the Florida Attorney General's Office has filed six court actions involving 14 moving companies following investigations into deceptive marketing practices, unlawfully misappropriating customers' property and holding personal possessions hostage.

Smash-and-Dash Gun Store Burglary

Defendant Sentenced to 40 years in Smash-and-Dash Gun Store Burglary

Case

Attorney General Ashley Moody's Office of Statewide Prosecution announced a 40-year prison sentence for a defendant found guilty of a gun store burglary. James Moore previously entered an open plea to burglary of a structure while using a vehicle as an instrument and 35 counts of grand theft of a firearm. Moore is one of a larger group based in Orlando, using stolen vehicles to facilitate several types of smash-and-dash burglaries. The 20-member group stole from department and retail stores to steal guns, jewelry, electronics, sporting goods and more. Thursday, Judge Frances Perrone sentenced Moore to 40 years in prison.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "These criminals deliberately wrecked a Tampa store to steal firearms. Not only did they steal property, they also stole a sense of security from the surrounding neighborhood. I applaud the great work of my Office of Statewide Prosecution securing this strong prison sentence and continuing to seek prison time for the remaining defendants."

Try the touch test. Get some paper towels and press them against the low spots in the carpet. The paper towels will draw the moisture out and reveal if the carpet is wet under the surface. Some carpets can be several inches thick to insulate from heat and sound. If the paper towel becomes wet, it could mean water has gotten into the car.

Investigate the interior. Look under the seats and dash for corrosion and rust and look for exposed metal that is untreated. There are metal springs under the front seats that are usually not painted. If they are rusted, that is a sign the interior has been wet. Look for mud and debris in places they don't belong.

Inspect the instrument panel. Turn on the key and perform a bulb test. Make sure every bulb lights up. If a system has an issue, removing the warning bulb can hide it. Many times, vehicles that have flooded have malfunctions in their anti-brake and air bag systems. If the light comes on and then goes out after the bulb test, that's an indicator that the system is on and has no active faults.

Take it to a professional. Let a service and repair technician inspect your vehicle. He or she can raise the car and look underneath to see if there is any mud, sticks or rocks in the suspension. A professional can check the oil in the differentials to make sure they contain no water. Spend a few dollars to have it looked over to give yourself peace of mind.


