We are now at about the halfway point of the 60-day Legislative Session in Tallahassee. We are reminded of how blessed we are to be living in this great state and it is an honor to be able

SB 202 recently passed its third and final committee and is headed to the floor. This bill establishes universal school choice across the State of Florida. This bill puts parents in the driver's seat regarding their child's education, provides parents and students with the full array of educational opportunities, and allows every student in Florida to receive an education in a setting fit to their own individual needs. Through this legislation, families of students who fall below 185% of the federal poverty level (FPL) will be prioritized, with a second priority for households with income below 400% of FPL, to receive an empowerment account to take education dollars earmarked for their child and choose among a variety of options to customize their child's k-12 education.


As the fentanyl crisis continues to





All of these resources are designed to warn specific audiences about tactics scammers may use to steal their money or identity.





Ring, Arresting 35 of Dollars' Worth of **Illicit Drugs**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney Bureau of Investigation, the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration and the U.S. Postal Inspection Service today announced the dismantling of a massive drug trafficking ring—arresting 35 suspects and seizing millions of dollars' worth of drugs. These defendants made up one of the largest cocaine trafficking rings in Florida history, transporting drugs from Puerto Rico to sell in Florida. The defendants also trafficked illicit fentanyl and are responsible for violent crimes, including torture.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "This massive drug-trafficking organization moved millions of dollars' worth of cocaine from Puerto Rico into the United States. They used torture to intimidate and maintain a stranglehold on the market, and supplied Central Florida with so much cocaine that the price of the illicit substance in that area actually dropped. I am proud of my Statewide Prosecutors for working with Florida and federal law enforcement to dismantle this dangerous drug-trafficking ring and ensure these suspects face justice.'

The joint investigation by MBI, DEA and

AG Moody, MBI and USPIS seized more than 339 kilograms of F e d e r a l L a w cocaine, 71 grams of fentanyl and 152 grams Enforcement of heroin—a seizure worth more than \$8 Dismantled Massive million. The investigation also uncovered Cocaine Trafficking that the traffickers tortured people who crossed the group, and on one occasion and Seizing Millions burned a man with an iron.

he defendants are charged with racketeering, conspiracy to commit racketeering, traffic in and conspiracy to be General Ashley Moody, the Metropolitan trafficking in cocaine and fentanyl—all firstdegree felonies.

TAX-SEASON SCAMS SERIES: Tax Identity Theft

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody is continuing the 2023 Tax-Season Scams Series with a warning for Floridians about Tax Identity Theft. In 2021, the Federal Trade Commission received 1.4 million reports of identity theft, and the FTC reports that the tax-filing season is the most common time for identity theft.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "Identity thieves love tax season and as we continue our series warning about common tax-related scams, I want filers to be extra cautious and take proactive steps to guard their personal information."

Securing personal information, both online and offline, is one of the best ways to guard against tax identity theft. Physical documents containing sensitive information should be shredded before being thrown away into the trash. If a personal shredder is not available, communities often host local shredding days. Utilizing multi-factor authentication, as well as incorporating strong passwords, can spoil an online scammer's plan of obtaining personal information.

Attorney General Moody recommends these tips to avoid tax identity theft:

- File taxes early so a scammer can't file using stolen information;
- Apply for an <u>Electronic Filing PIN</u> number with the Internal Revenue Service for increased safety;
- Never use the same passwords across multiple websites or applications;
- Limit the number of companies that receive personal information;
- Avoid filing taxes in public;
- Take sensitive outgoing mail to a post office location rather than placing in a home mailbox: and
- Protect an electronic device with firewalls and anti-virus software, and keep up to date with security patches and updates.

Anyone who falls victim to tax identity theft should complete IRS Form 14039, Identity Theft Affidavit, at IRS.gov and attach it to the year's tax return. Taxpayers should also check credit reports regularly to ensure that there are no fraudulent accounts opened with stolen information.

WINTER HAVEN, Fla. -Today, Governor Ron DeSantis

marked the third year since "15 Days to Slow the Spread" was implemented in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and put the United States under a state of emergency. 'Governor Ron 15 days to slow the spread, and today, with nearly 100% of the American public having contracted the coronavirus, the federal government continues to rely on fear and manipulation to peddle vaccines that don't prevent transmission," said Surgeon General Dr. Joseph Ladapo. - Vacation-Rental Fraud: Fake postings offering vacation-rental properties created by scammers who take the victim's money, leaving the traveler without accommodations;
- Taxi or Ride-Sharing Scams: Unlicensed or unmetered drivers that operate out of airports or major tourist destinations, charging undisclosed or flatrate fees that are more expensive than realmetered fares:
- <u>Fake-Ticket Scams</u>: Scammers create fake websites, ads or physical tickets to trick visitors into buying worthless entrance passes;
- Vehicle-Rental Scams: Damaged sports-rental equipment or vehicles such as

jet skis, scooters and boats are rented to tourists and the owner claims the renter damaged the vehicle; and

Credit-Card Skimming: The illegal copying of the magnetic strip of a credit or ATM card—often occurring when a credit card is taken out of sight, or by placing illicit skimming machines on card readers or terminals.
